

More "Blah, Blah, Blah" from Msgr. Mark

Like a sandwich cookie, with the sweet crème layer pressed between two (less exciting) wafers, you have learned that after the last two

weeks of heavier columns about what "normal" means under COVID and the "unforgiveable sin," it's time for something more newsy and (perhaps) lighter. Enjoy! No need to brush.

- First, we have lost a staff member. **Chris Krasowski**, head of maintenance at St. Michael and Resurrection Parishes for the last seven years, has sold his house in Wausau and moved up near Rhinelander where he hopes to work for something less than forty hours a week in the building and renovation trades. His great accomplishment here was making our lighting and heating and air conditioning systems much more energy efficient. Goodbye, Chris.
- Joining the staff to fill Chris's spot is **Brian Skrzypchak** (you would never guess this from how that looks, but it's pronounced, "SCRIP-chick"). Brian is from Wausau, a member at Holy Name Parish, and has worked for more than a dozen years in maintenance at Newman High School. This will be a step up in responsibility for Brian. He has said he is already impressed by how many buildings we have. He has already proven himself to be a hard worker, and Resurrection parishioner Steve Robison is working with him to learn the trickier parts of maintenance here. Welcome, Brian.
- And speaking of just how many buildings the two parishes own, Resurrection Parish has dropped that number by one, as we have sold the larger house the parish had owned on Townline Road. While it had been used over the years as housing for pastors and associates, it hasn't been lived in for the last ten years and, as will happen, was beginning to suffer from the lack of a loving tenant. With housing prices high, the time to part with it seemed right. We still retain ten acres of land to the south and west of the house for future parish use and the smaller house to the east. The latter property was granted to the parish as a Life Estate ... which means the current resident is guaranteed the right to reside there as long as they choose to.
- With the end of the month of June, fiscal year 2020-2021 is (as they say) "in the can." It has taken a while for the numbers to settle, but by next week I will be ready to offer a fiscal review of the year for any who want to hear it in another "Seven Minutes More" after-Mass presentation. We have several baptisms scheduled over the next weeks, so the presentations will extend over a couple of weeks. Next weekend (August 14-15), those at the 4:00 pm, 7:30 am and 10:30 am liturgies will have a chance to hear all about it. Though the word will already be out via the grapevine by then, the 9:00 am Mass crew will have a chance to hear it from the horse's mouth (me) on Sunday, September 5th.
- And "thank you" to the many of you who have offered to help us respond to a request from the children of Bob and Ethel Brown to assist a St. Lucian whom Bob had befriended, and who is now training to become a nurse at NTC, make her dialysis appointments. I covered the first week ... and if I can do it, it can't be too difficult. I'll be organizing some protocols for the volunteer drivers so we are all on the same page. Stay tuned! I am MOST pleased we could honor Bob and Ethel by being of assistance.

Readings for the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary August 15

Revelation 11:19a; 12:1-6a, 10ab;
1 Corinthians 15:20-27; Luke 1:39-56

Today's feast takes us beyond the pages of the Bible (there are no stories in the New Testament recording actual details of Mary's life after Pentecost), reaching to ancient tradition to extend the lines of Gospel truth to address our own need for Easter. At the hour of her passing, Christ applied his triumph over death to her. Scan Revelation and the Gospel of Luke for references to Christ's defeat of Sin and Death ... while Paul, in today's passage from 1 Corinthians, sees in Christ's rising (as the first fruit) a sign of the Great Harvest to come. Today is a little bit of Easter held off for late summer applied to Mary, the first Disciple. May it also someday be applied to us.

COVID procedures at Sunday Masses at the Eastside Parishes updated August 8, 2021

As the expectations have changed over the last few weeks, here's a rundown of our current procedures at worship:

- For the unvaccinated, the continued wearing of face coverings and social distancing is encouraged but not required; those who have been vaccinated are welcome to mask as they see fit.
- Most of each church will be available for seating, with two exceptions: first, the pew at the front and the pew at the back of each section will continue to have an empty "buffer" row (behind or ahead of it) for those who would welcome more space between them and others. And for the near future, the 7:30 am Mass at Resurrection will continue to require 6' distancing and the wearing of masks by all.
- Taking the offering "passively" at the entrances of the church will continue for now.
- Our current Mass schedule (one on Saturday late afternoon and three on Sunday morning) is only for the time being, and we expect to adjust worship times again as we edge our way back to "normal."

Stay tuned. Things change.

Faith Formation & Sacramental Preparation – Registration Open




