Parish Life

More "Blah, Blah, Blah" from Msgr. Mark

I hope you have seen the pattern'in our late Lenten liturgies. The Gospel passages for the last three Sundays (the parables of the Fruitless

Fig Tree, the Prodigal Son, and today's narrative of the Woman Caught in Adultery) are all powerful statements of God's mercy. It's ground that needs to be gone over again and again. No one is too far gone, too crooked, too bad to be removed from the Father's care ... and no one is too good, too religious, or too full of virtue, not to need the same compassion. It wasn't the prodigal, younger son's confession that sparked his dad's forgiveness, but his father's love that triggered the confession. Never, ever, ever forget that.

That is why I am such a fan of Examinations of Conscience ... a series of questions that I can lay against my own heart to help me see my own sinfulness. Acknowledging my faults, recognizing my need for change, are the most mundane examples I know of God working on me. We don't find God once we get in the confessional; it's evidence of His grace at work in us that takes us there.

So, as I have done in previous Fifth Sundays of Lent, here is another example of one such self-exam I came across. It's not based on the Ten Commandments or the Prayer of St. Francis, as some self-exams are, but on a line from the great saint and mystic, John of the Cross:

"*In the evening of life, we will be judged on love alone"* (*Dichos 64*). If that is so of the end of our days, Lord,

might that not also be so of the end of every day?

In the evening of this day, Lord, I will be judged on love alone. How will you judge this day in my life, Lord?

What's your critique of how I spent the last 24 hours? What does my day look like, through your eyes? How did my thoughts mirror your love? How did my words speak your love? How did my deeds make present your love? How did I love those I live with? How did my generosity reflect your love? How did my silence welcome your loving presence? How did my prayer invite your love into my heart?

In the evening of this day, Lord, I will be judged on love alone. Even if I spent most of this day alone, even if I neither met nor spoke

with anyone, how loving were my thoughts of those who've hurt me?

- ... of those who disagree with me? ... those who don't think well of me? ... those who have forgotten me? ... those who speak ill of me?
- ... those whom I have hurt?
- ... those whose stories I neither know nor understand?

In the evening of this day, Lord, I will be judged on love alone.

- How did I reach out in love to those waiting to hear from me?
- ... those who are sick? ... those who are poor? ... those with needs I might help with?
- ... those I'm estranged from? ... those who are alone?

In the evening of this day, Lord, I will be judged on love alone. In every moment of every day and night, Lord, you love me with mercy and forgiveness: give me the grace to love others as freely and as fully as I am loved by you.

Protect me, Lord, while I'm awake and watch over me when I sleep that awake, I might keep watch with you and asleep, rest in your loving peace. Amen.

Readings for Palm Sunday (April 10)

(Isaiah 50:4-7; Psalm 22; Philippians 2:6-11; Luke 22:14-23:56)

"Lord, I am prepared to go to die with you." Doubtless, St. Peter meant what he said, but in a few hours, he will have denied that he even knew Jesus and will have fled the scene. Christ had foreseen Peter's betrayal and had told him so. We do not know how this made Peter feel. One bitter lesson he surely learned when the cock crowed was that warm feelings without commensurate action is empty. The significance of Jesus' final week on earth—his triumphal entry into Jerusalem, disruption of the temple's commerce, disputes, teachings, Last Supper, arrest, trial, crucifixion, and death—is much greater than his sidekick's betrayal. But Peter's courage in safety, and cowardice in danger, reflect the sort of faithlessness with which most of us can identify. With what figures in this great story do <u>you</u> identify? Denying Peter, betraying Judas, indecisive Pilate, clueless Simon, the obedient non-questioning soldiers, the faithful women? How have you been called to a change of heart by a personal failure?

Most of our services on Palm Sunday will start in the Gathering Spaces!

As we enter into Holy Week next Sunday, the Blessing and Procession of the Palms that marks Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem at the 4 pm Saturday and 8:30 am and 10:30 am Sunday Masses, will begin in our churches' gathering areas (not the worship area itself). So, don't be surprised when you enter church and are invited to pick an unblessed palm and remain standing with others before the service starts. At the 5:30 pm Mass at Resurrection, where we continue to socially distance and mask, worshippers will be invited to pick up a palm as they enter, and they will be blessed as they hold them in their pews. Just thought you would like to know.

thoughtful walk with Jesus on his Way of the Cross each week of Lent. At Resurrection Parish, the Stations will be celebrated on Lenten Tuesdays at 6:20pm (after the regular Novena). At St. Michael Parish, the Stations will be celebrated on Lenten Wednesdays at 5:15 pm.



COVID procedures at Sunday Masses Here's a rundown of our current procedures at worship:

- For the unvaccinated, the wearing of face coverings and social distancing remain recommended.
- The first and last pew in each section will continue to have a "buffer" row behind or in front of them for those who would welcome more space between themselves and others and, for the time being the 5:30 pm Saturday Mass at Resurrection will continue to require 6' distancing and the wearing of masks.
- We are not <u>formally</u> inviting the assembly to exchange the Sign of Peace beyond a verbal greeting. You are welcome to exchange it within your family/household grouping, but for now it might be best not to assume that those around you will welcome a handshake.
