



#### **Readings for the Second Sunday of Easter** April 24

Acts 5:12-16; Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24; Revelation 1:9-19; John 20:19-31

During the fifty days of Easter, we read different types of Resurrection stories. Some focus on the empty tomb and describe how the disciples come slowly to believe in Jesus' rising. Others narrate appearances of the risen Lord in which he commissions the disciples. Today's Gospel is both a coming-to-faith story and a commissioning. Jesus appears on Easter night to his disciples and hands over his own mission from the Father. Thomas is absent, and later declares he will not believe the disciples' story until he himself sees Christ and actually touches the nail marks on his body. A week later Jesus gives him what he requires in an appearance, and his resistance melts, offering the strongest statement of Christ's divinity the New Testament: "My Lord and my God!" Jesus follows with a beatitude to us who believe without direct evidence. What is your evidence for the Resurrection? Where can you point to Christ giving you tastes of eternal life right now?

#### Copies of the "Little White Books" for Easter are available in both churches (while supply lasts)

We hope you found the Black Book a helpful addition to your daily prayer during Lent and Triduum. The "Little White Book" devotionals for the Easter season are at the doors. For now, if you would limit yourself one per household ... and if there are remaining copies after Easter Day, we will invite those who would like to perhaps pick up a second to share with a neighbor or friend.

#### A note about hospital visitations

Fr. Mark, Fr. Joe, and parish nurse Pam Frary, are eager to stay in touch with our parish members in the area hospitals. This is not a bother ... this is their job! ## More "Blah, Blah, Blah" from Msgr. Mark

Well, once again I took my best whack at it ... preaching Easter, I mean. It may seem to the average churchgoer that

we make a much bigger deal about Christmas than we do about Easter. I understand that, but it's not in fact the case. What makes Christmas seem the bigger deal at first glance is the way our culture (and specifically the economic juggernaut that is December) has piled on to making Christmas something huge. Christmas (God become flesh) is important, but Easter (the God-Man defeating Death) is epic. If Jesus had not arisen from death, his birth wouldn't matter all that much.

If you think I am exaggerating, let me lean on a couple preachers who have taught me. The first is St. Paul, who writes a group of baby Christians about twenty years after Easter: "If Christ has not been raised, then empty is your faith. Then we [Paul means himself and his fellow preachers] are also false witnesses to God because we testified about God that he raised Christ (whom he did not raise if in fact the dead are not raised). For if the dead are not raised, neither has Christ been raised, and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is in vain, you are still in your sins ... [and] those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If in this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable of people." [1 Corinthians 15:14-19]

You see that? If there was no Easter, there would be no Christmas. And where we should look for the evidence of the Resurrection is not in an empty tomb but in changed lives. Here is my other model Easter preacher, John Chrysostom, from the  $4^{\rm th}$  century:

"That the preaching of these men was indeed divine is brought home to us in this way. How else could twelve uneducated men, who lived on lakes and rivers and wastelands, get the idea for such an immense enterprise? How could men who perhaps had never been in a city or a public square think of setting out to do battle with the whole world? That they were fearful, timid men, the evangelist makes clear; he did not reject the fact or try to hide their weaknesses. Indeed, he turned these into a proof of the truth. What did he say of them? That when Christ was arrested, the others fled, despite all the miracles they had seen, while he who was leader of the others denied him!

How then to account for the fact that these men, who in Christ's lifetime did not stand up to the attacks by the Jews, set forth to do battle with the whole world once Christ was dead—if as you claim, Christ did not rise and speak to them and rouse their courage? Did they perhaps say to themselves: 'What is this? He could not save himself when he was alive, but now that he is dead, he will extend a helping hand to us? In his lifetime he brought no nation under his banner, but by uttering his name we will win over the whole world?' Would it not be wholly irrational even to think such thoughts, much less to act on them? It is evident then that if they had not seen him risen and had proof of his power, they would not have risked so much."

The real evidence of Easter then is not near-death experiences, caterpillars who become butterflies, or the return of spring (as wonderful as all of these are). The only proof that matters are transformed lives. Let us help the world with that, you and I.
