# Parish Life

## More "Blah, Blah, Blah" from Msgr. Mark

There are school calendars, religious calendars, and sports calendars, of course, but three weeks back we turned the page on the Eastside

Parishes' fiscal calendar year. Good-bye, 2021-2022! So how did we do? Here's a preliminary look. Do recall that while St. Michael Parish and Resurrection have the same staff and co-operate on the same programming, each takes care of its own buildings and keeps separate financial books. I am happy to say that (with a couple warnings) the fiscal news for both parishes is positive.

First, on the Diocesan Annual Appeal front both parishes have met and surpassed their targets both in pledges and cash in support of the work of the Church beyond ourselves. Resurrection Parish's share of the DAA this year was \$74,350 and, by June 30, \$84,495 had been contributed. So, the Diocese has returned \$10,145 in overages, which will be directed to the parish's endowment. The people of St. Michael's Parish contributed a wee bit more: \$84,982 ... but they also had a higher goal: \$77,485. That means that \$7,497 has been returned to the parish, which will be directed to reducing our debt. Yeah!

And speaking of St. Michael's debt, we have continued to work away at it, as the We Believe Campaign enters its fourth year. The "thermometer" in the Gathering Area tracking our remaining debt has taken a jump. Remember, on that super-sized poster, a higher temperature means a declining debt. As of July 1, our pool of red ink has shrunk from an original \$2,374,013 in 2018 to \$710,200. The aim of the We Believe front was to reduce our debt by a million dollars (so earning forgiveness of old interest) and then, if possible, moving on to raise the cash needed to replace St. Michael Church's seventy-year-old HVAC system. With a year left in the campaign payment period, we've met all of those goals ... raising more than a million dollars for debt retirement, earning \$300,000 in interest forgiveness, and paying for the new heating and air conditioning system. Looking at it another way, we have erased \$1,663,813 of indebtedness in the last years. I am so grateful to you all. There are still a number of people continuing to work on completing their pledges ... so there is reason to hope we will be able to drop our remaining debt a little more in the year ahead. With the return of rising interest rates, this is a big deal for the St. Michael's.

But I also have a couple of warnings: •••



Warning #1 won't be much of a surprise. The cost of things has taken off. We are cutting costs here and there, but I think the most important challenge is offering our staff an appropriate cost of living increase to keep them with us. The parishes have a balanced budget for 2022-2023, and I know you are all facing the same inflationary challenges at home, but you know what they say about "the squeaky wheel." I'll speak more about this at my usual "Seven Minutes More" presentation on the parishes' financial standing in early August.

Warning #2 may initially sound like super news: there won't be the usual Diocesan Annual Appeal this fall. But wait...the DAA isn't disappearing, but is being folded into a pretty serious fundraising push for capital needs in all the parishes of the Diocese that is being done in waves. (Perhaps you have heard whispers from neighbors or friends who belong to the other city Catholic parishes.) Our turn will come at the start of 2023, and so you will hear more from me on that in time.

But for today, the main message is my gratitude for your generosity to the parishes. Thank you all!

- One of the clergy records a reading from the daily Mass and shares a 5-8 minute (audio-only) reflection.



### Readings for the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 31

Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23; Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11; Luke 12:13-21

Fasten your seatbelts: Jesus is asked a question about money today. Well, actually, it isn't a direct question. He is invited to weigh in on a family fight about an inheritance. The poor guy requests his help in convincing his brother to "play fair," but gets far more than he had planned for, as Jesus launches into a warning (and a parable) on how concern for wealth can be an obstacle to entering the Kingdom of God. Jesus brings up the matter of money once each in the gospels of Matthew and Mark (and never in John). In contrast the subject comes up eight times in Luke—which probably says something about the audience Luke was writing for ... and Jesus himself. In the parable, what is the farmer's problem? And his solution? Why is he a fool? What does becoming "rich in what matters to God" look like?
