
Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Parish Life

More "Blah, Blah, Blah" from Msgr. Mark

In case you stepped away for the summer, here are the highlights of the Eastside Parish saga with associate pastors. First, Fr.

Joe was going to stay on for a third year at Newman and us ... until he wasn't, as in mid-May the call came that he was needed as pastor of the two Catholic parishes in the towns of Viroqua and Coon Valley. As a consequence, we were told that there wasn't an associate priest this year to come to Wausau and serve as chaplain at the middle and high school and no priest to assist here and throughout the deanery.

So, we made some adjustments. Fr. Sam Martin, pastor at Holy Name, stepped forward to be the tip of the spear of the clergy presence at Newman (with the other priests in town continuing to pinch-hit as needed). In late June, I sat down with the deacons and the rest of the parish staff and redistributed some of the tasks that had been Fr. Joe's responsibility. With just one priest, there was also a "no-associate financial dividend" ... and it didn't take me more than ten minutes to decide where to distribute it. "Inflation, inflation, inflation" is the constant cry these days, so we used the budget savings to give our staff a fair increase and tucked a little way for higher utilities bills. I thought we had done well of making lemonade of the lemon of Fr. Joe's reassignment.

Then, in the second week of July, I received a phone call from Fr. Woody Pace, the Vicar for Clergy. He was the fellow who, two month before, announced that Fr. Joe was needed elsewhere. Only this time he was calling to tell me that now, suddenly, the Diocese did have a young priest ready, willing, and able to come to Wausau to serve both as Newman chaplain and an associate at our two parishes. And who was this sudden find? None other than a fellow who had served well for a few months as a seminary intern in the summer of 2019: Fr. Eric Mashak. Good news? Yes. Only, he wouldn't be able to start until Wednesday, August 24 ... the day before school starts.

The assignment of priests in the Diocese can seem like a complicated board game ... think of "Chutes and Ladders" for grown-ups. There are a lot of spots hungry for leadership, and always a few less priests and deacons than you would like to have to cover them. So, ideally a priest moves if, and only if, the spot where they are going to land is vacant and the place where they are leaving has someone lined up to come and serve. So, before Fr. Eric can leave his role as the associate at Plover to come to Wausau, Fr. Juan Pedro, the associate at St. Matthew's here in Wausau who will replace him, must be ready to leave ... and that can't happen until the recently assigned pastor at St. Matt's, Fr. Sebastian Kolodziejczyk, is home and settled following his vacation in Poland, which was scheduled before these changes were arranged. How very weird! In any case, the grand switch will take place in ten days. Stay off I-39 between Wausau and Plover on the 24th, so you don't get run over by Eric or Juan Pedro moving back and forth.

On the weekend of August 20 and 21, please welcome Fr. Kyle Laylan, a Mission Cooperative visiting priest, here to speak about the mission works of Casa Hogar Juan Pablo II in Peru (see more information on page 3). His visit is an opportunity for me to take off to St. John's Abbey for my annual retreat. Given all the excitement with comings and goings, I need it.

Readings for the Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time August 21, 2022

Isaiah 66:18-21; Hebrews 12:5-7,11-13; Luke 13:22-30

"Depart from me!" What jarring words on a Sunday that celebrates the coming of the patriarchs and people from all nations to the table of God's kingdom. Even more unsettling is the fact that these words are spoken to the very people who protest: "We ate and drank in your company." How it is that some who listened to Jesus' teaching and sat at table with him will be denied entrance to the kingdom banquet? Jesus' answer is simple: "I do not know you." Ouch! By the image of the "narrow gate," it seems that something more than mere showing up is called for. How does today's reading from Hebrews address the "narrow way"? How does regarding suffering as discipline change your attitude toward it?

There is a "Seven Minutes More" presentation at all the Masses this weekend on how we ended the 2021-2022 fiscal year.

After all of the Masses this Lord's Day, August 13-14, Fr. Mark will offer a brief update on how we finished up the last fiscal year and the challenges we face in 2022-2023.

The handout will cover both parishes, but the presentation will favor news about St. Michael after the 4:00 pm and 10:30 am Masses and matters at Resurrection after the 5:30 pm and 8:30 am Masses.

Though it is not a holyday of obligation this year, celebrate the Assumption of Mary on Monday evening, August 15, at 5:30 pm. In addition to our Lord's Day celebrations, there are other occasions in the Church calendar so



central to who we are that Catholics are asked to squeeze extra time out of their routines to come to worship. Mary, the Mother of God, is a template for God's designs for us all—and on Monday the 15th, we will consider how God's care for her at the end of her life speaks of His intentions for us all. Falling on a Monday this year, there is no "obligation" to attend Mass, but please consider celebrating a bit of Easter held over into late summer at our usual 5:30 pm Monday worship time at Resurrection.


