

Next Sunday Reflection Material

Readings for the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time September 4, 2022

Sirach 3:17-20,28-29; Hebrews 12:18-24a; Luke 14:1,7-14

Pay attention: Jesus spends lots of time in Luke's Gospel at the supper table, and more is at stake in his advice about where to sit at table than a lesson in etiquette. He presents another example of the "downward mobility" that he has predicted for himself (and expects of those who would follow him). The sharing of a meal signified that there was a relationship between the host and the quests. If invited, the poor, the crippled, the blind, lack the means to reciprocate. To give without thought of return is itself a form of humility, the very opposite of self-promotion. As was the Master, so should the servant be. Name a time that you were changed by receiving from someone who expected nothing in return.

Mission Cooperative Visitor for the Summer: Fr. Kyle Laylan

When this area was initially opened to European settlement, the Church wasn't far behind. Missionary priests would follow the rivers that served as highways into this region and gather Irish, French-Canadian, and German settlers to establish the Church. Their salaries, catechetical books, and materials for building mission stations were often paid for by mission societies made up of clergy and laity in Germany and France where the Catholic community was already well established. Now it is our turn. So, annually the parishes of the Diocese welcome a priest or

religious with experience of the emerging Church to speak about the life and needs there. So, this weekend, August 20-21, Fr. Kyle Laylan, a priest of the Diocese who has worked at the Casa Hogar Juan Pablo II orphanage in Peru will preside and preach at all the Masses. Do welcome him.!

Friday Morning Men's Group this fall will discuss a new book by **Bishop Robert Barron.**

Faith Formation Registration

Registration forms, calendars, and information are available on our website for both Faith Formation (1-12^{*}), and Sacramental Preparation (typically 2^{nd} grade for 1^{st} Reconciliation and Communion, and typically 10^{ch} grade for Confirmation).

Detailed information on texts used for all age groups is in the Faith Formation Handbook and available online, as well as in the hard copy registration packets in the back of church. Middle and high school will be highlighting a comprehensive youth ministry focus within the class sessions and beyond (for special events like retreats and service experiences.)

*You'll notice that all high school youth are **invited** to continue receiving ongoing faith formation through 12th grade. Receiving the sacrament of Confirmation in 10th grade does not change the need to learn the story of our faith and how best to integrate faith into our daily lives: if anything it deepens the hunger to do precisely that.


