MARY, CAN I HOLD THE BABY?

On the Feast of the Holy Family, the song, “Mary, Can I Hold the Baby?” composed by Parishioner Tom Dillett was played along with video slides as part of the homily. A good number of parishioners have asked if they could have a copy of the song. The answer is YES. Taken from the live-streamed broadcast of the Holy Mass on December 26, 2021, a DVD is available and contains Fr. Michael’s homily along with the featured Christmas song. The song segment of the DVD is a beautiful production of graphics set to music and lyrics of this new Christmas song, sung by John Schindhelm and accompanied by Karen Schulteis. The song tells an imagined story of how a 10-year old shepherd boy meets Jesus, Mary and Joseph in the stable in Bethlehem on Christmas night. The song was written in 2019 by Tom, who used the stage name “Red Deacon” before he retired. Also available on a separate CD is the song, “Mary Can I Hold the Baby?” The DVD and CD are both now available in the parish office and may be purchased separately or together. A free-will donation of \$5 is being asked for the DVD and \$1 for the CD. All proceeds will go towards the continuation and upkeep of the live streaming of Masses.

This weekend, as the Church celebrates the Baptism of our Lord, Jesus Christ, we liturgically bring Christmas 2021 to an end. As we do so, I would like to extend a thank you to the many parishioners who took part in the Giving Tree and provided gifts to those in need. CHRISTMAS VACATION PROJECTS

Over the past three weeks, two major projects have been completed in the Rectory upstairs apartment unit and Rectory basement. The upstairs unit had new carpeting installed and it was completely painted. The Rectory was carpeted by Stu’s Flooring and painted by a talented group of parishioners who spent two weeks painting. A big thank you to the volunteers under the expertise of parishioner and painter Tom Rozina. His helpers included Vic Postotnik, Bob Hogan, Jim Andritsos, Gary Tveten, and Tony Adams. On behalf of the parish, a big hearty thank you to you all.

Also, after a sewer backup in the basement of the Rectory early last fall, we decided to rip out the carpeting along with the 40-year old linoleum and have the entire basement retiled. The expense of these projects will eventually come out of the Love One Another campaign. Thank you for your generous support of the parish.

This week, two new Sisters of Notre Dame will be moving into the Rectory upstairs apartment, Sr. Betty and Sr. Laura Jean. Sr. Rita Clare (who has lived here for nine years) and Sr. Mary Alyce both moved into the brand new Notre Dame convent on the Mount Mary University campus. Their new convent is called Trinity Woods.


RESPECT LIFE MASS WITH THE ARCHBISHOP


