



FOR THE GLORY OF GOD

We might be familiar with the motto "*Ad Maiorem Dei Gloriam*," "For the Greater Glory of God" used by the Society of Jesus or Jesuit community. This saying refers to our daily actions being done with the intent of giving glory to God. In this weekend's second reading, Saint Paul encouraged the community in Corinth to offer their work for the glory of God. Saint Paul reminds us of the beauty and joy that comes from a life pleasing to God. Many times, people have their priorities backwards; their daily actions are self-serving. People work hard to increase their own glory or the glory of others rather than the glory of God. It seems easier to do things if we do them for money, fame, power, pleasure, or our own glory. Saint Paul teaches us that it is important to do good things for the right reason. So, whatever you do in your daily life do it for the glory of God.

If You Wish, You Can Make Me Clean

In the gospel, Mark narrates the beautiful encounter between a leper and Jesus: "A leper came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him and said, 'If you wish, you can make me clean.' Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, and said to him, 'I do will it. Be made clean.'" There is so much we can learn from this encounter. 1) The leper came to Jesus because he knew he was sick, and he needed him to cure him. There is no miracle if the leper is not willing to come to Jesus. All of us are in need of spiritual healing; the first step we need to take is to approach Jesus. We cannot get the peace or forgiveness we need if we stay away from the presence of Jesus in the sacraments of the Church. 2) The leper begged Jesus. He doesn't come demanding of Jesus to be healed. The leper knows the right approach is to beg because he does not deserve to be healed. What is the attitude you have when you approach Jesus? We need kneel and beg for his presence. 3) The leper knows he can do nothing to heal himself. He comes with a humble heart, prostrates himself in the presence of Jesus and waits for Jesus mercy. There is nothing in this life we deserve. In time of need, do you accept the will of Jesus in your life or do you demand your own will? The leper had the right attitude when asking Jesus for his will to be done in his life. Let the leper be an example of our attitude before God.

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten season. Lent runs from Ash Wednesday until the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. During those days, we prepare ourselves for the celebrations of the Paschal Mysteries—Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence in the universal Church. It is the day when we begin our Lenten observances of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

In the tradition of the Church, Ash Wednesday, has been a day when the faithful come to church to receive ashes, which are a sacramental reminder of our human condition. When the priest imposes the ashes on the faithful, there are two phrases he could say: "Repent and believe in the gospel" or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." These biblical sayings remind us of the need to celebrate Ash Wednesday. This day is an opportunity for us to transform our lives into the likeness of Christ our Lord. We are called to repent and accept and live out the message of Jesus in our daily lives. We are also reminded that we were created by God and without him we are nothing. The ashes remind us of our mortality. Our awareness of who we are and how short life is should lead us to a deeper appreciation of God's love for us.

We are blessed to be able to celebrate Ash Wednesday in Church. Because of COVID-19, the distribution of ashes will look a bit different. Everyone will be able to receive ashes either on the top of the head or with a cotton swab on the forehead. When you are about to receive the ashes, make sure you bow your head before the priest or the deacon if you prefer to receive the ashes on the head, or keep your head up if you would like to receive the ashes on your forehead. We will live-stream all Masses and distribute communion and ashes after Mass in front of the school to those who listen in the parking lot. We look forward to the start of the Lenten season.

LIVE THE LITURGY

Everybody has a place at the table, and nobody deserves to feel inferior, unworthy, unwanted, or marginalized. It is not part of God's vision. Jesus came to heal, make things whole, set things right, and restore relationships. No one is to feel unwelcome or alienated from the community. Whether we like it or not, this message is at the core of the Gospel. It makes a lot of sense when you think about it. Perhaps this is why people kept coming from everywhere to listen to Jesus speak and to be in his presence. He made perfect sense. Most of us have no issue buying into this vision. We run into trouble, however, when we fall into the trap of privilege and power. We diverge from God's vision when the powerful begin to control who is entitled to wholeness and inclusion, and greed becomes a driving force. Prejudice and entitlement have no place in the kingdom of God, and even the most needy and hurting among us are worthy of the compassion Jesus desires to offer. There are no easy solutions to the world's dilemmas. But one thing is for certain, no one can be singled out, excluded or mistreated. Everyone matters.

THE HOLY SEASON OF LENT

“Lent is a new beginning, a path leading to the certain goal of Easter, Christ’s victory over death. This season urgently calls us to conversion. Christians are asked to return to God ‘with all their hearts’ (Joel 2:12), to refuse to settle for mediocrity and grow in friendship with the Lord.” ~ Pope Francis.

This Wednesday, February 17 marks the beginning of Lent, a time in the Catholic tradition in which we slow down, reflect and pray more, fast, and give alms to the poor. SCL offers many ways to live out these practices:

Ash Wednesday: Remind yourself to “repent and believe in the Gospel.” For those who sign up to come to church, ashes will be distributed on Wednesday, February 17 during Masses at 7:00 and 9:00am and 7:00pm and during prayer services at 12:00 and 4:00pm. Ashes will be either sprinkled on top of the head or applied by cotton swab to the forehead by ministers using both face masks and face shields. *Note: Masses will be live-streamed. There is no obligation to receive ashes.*

Fasting & Abstinence: Adults who are 18-59 years old and in good health are to fast and abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting consists of eating one full meal and two smaller meals that don’t add up to a single full meal. All Catholics who are 14 years and older are to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays in Lent.

Lenten Reflection Books: Reflect daily on the Scripture readings and other traditions of Lent using the booklets that are available in the vestibule of church.

Alms: Give alms to Catholic Relief Services Operation Rice Bowl or SCL’s own Society of St. Vincent de Paul via Text-to-Give or by sending donations to the parish office. Other alms options are Northfield Food Pantry or <https://www.catholicextension.org/>, an organization that serves poor Catholic faith communities in the US.

Stations of the Cross: Sign up for this time-honored prayer ritual or watch it on SCL’s YouTube channel each Friday in Lent at 7:00 pm. This Friday, the 8th graders from our school will lead the Stations.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: A communal celebration of God’s mercy and forgiveness will be scheduled for the latter part of March. More details will follow in future bulletins,

Parish Mission: Fr. Thomas Loya, pastor of Annunciation Byzantine Catholic Church in Homer Glen, will provide our mission on Sunday and Monday, March 7 & 8 at 7:00pm. More details will follow in future bulletins.


