THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

In this weekend's first reading, we are reminded of the Ten Commandments which God gave to Moses for the people of Israel to follow. They are also meant to help us live according to God's will by giving us the basic divine, moral, and natural laws necessary for a healthy and holy lifestyle. These commandments free our souls from the power of the world so that we can love God with all our hearts, minds, and souls. Let us take a look at the Ten Commandments and how they can help us live free from the power of sin.

The first three commandments refer to our relationship with God:

I. I am the Lord your God; you shall not have strange gods before me

The first commandment refers to the place God takes in our lives, how we respond to God's will, and how much we trust in him. Our faith tells us that there is One God who alone is to be at the center of our lives. Sometimes people replace God with things from this world. What place does God have in your life?

II. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain

This commandment refers to our attitude towards God. A name tells us the nature of a person or who the person is. Since God has created us and by his divine providence allows us to exist, we should reverence his holy name. Have you ever disrespected the name of God?

III. Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day

The third commandment refers to our appreciation of God's love for us. God needs nothing from us and we can do nothing to repay what he has done for us-- except be grateful. It is not our obligation but our need. We should keep holy the Lord's Day because we are grateful. Have you ever missed Sunday Mass or treated Sunday as any other day?

The last seven commandments refer to our relationships with others:

IV. Honor your father and your mother

This commandment is about family life, especially our relationship with our parents or guardians. Parents love their children and provide them with all they need to have a happy and fulfilled life. Children are to respect and obey their parents in return for the parents' love and care for their family. Do you love and respect your family?

V. You shall not kill

This commandment advocates respect for human life. Every person is created in God's image and likeness and

with the dignity of God's grace. For this reason, no one can take away the life of another person. We ought to promote the culture of life. In addition to physically killing a person, we can kill the soul of another by insulting or being unkind to them. Do you respect and promote the culture of life?

VI. You shall not commit adultery

This commandment indicates that the covenant of marriage is a bond between husband and wife based on the unconditional love they have for each other. The love they profess before the God and the Church should be based on trust and fidelity. This commandment also promotes respect and appreciation for our own bodies as well as others'.

VII. You shall not steal

This commandment encourages us to practice justice and respect for other people's possessions. Justice helps us respect our neighbor's rights, meaning we should not steal their time, dignity, well-being, honor, etc. nor their possessions. Have you ever been unfair to others?

VIII. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor

This commandment tells us to be truthful to God, others, and ourselves. Lying is the most direct offense against the truth and leaves a scar in our hearts that keeps us from feeling God's peace in our lives. False witness damages our relationship with God since Jesus is the truth. We have to know and love the truth to live the truth. Do you make an effort to always be truthful to God, others, and yourself?

IX. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife

This commandment aims to maintain purity of heart and mind. Our desires should be rightly ordered towards the things of God. We can have the virtue of modesty by treating others as God would treat them, by looking at others as God would look at them. What can you do to maintain purity of heart and mind?

X. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods

The last commandment calls us to be detached from worldly goods so as to be attached to the things of God. Nothing from this world can satisfy our deepest desire for God's presence. This commandment helps us reflect on what is important in our lives. The goods we have should only be a means to get closer to God. We shouldn't be attached to what we have or desire what we don't have. Have you ever desired someone else's possessions?



Moving into this third week of Lent, our parish continues to offer many ways to live out the traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.


Fasting & Abstinence: All Catholics who are 14 years and older are to abstain from eating meat on all Fridays in Lent.




