FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Sunday Readings

The book of the prophet Jeremiah reminds us of the promise God made to our forefathers. That promise was a covenant between God and his chosen people. God had made several other covenants such as: the covenant with Jonah, the covenant with Abraham, the Covenant with Moses, and the covenant with David. But Jeremiah speaks of a new and final covenant: "I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah." This new covenant will place a new law within the people and write it upon their hearts, a law based on love and mercy. This is a prophesy of the new covenant between God and his people. God sent a savior, Jesus who gave himself as a sacrifice for the sins of the world. Jesus gave us a new commandment of love, which is the foundation of the new covenant which Jeremiah speaks of.

In the gospel of John, Jesus speaks of the spiritual fruit we produce by dying to the world. He speaks of that in light of his imminent passion and death: "unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." It is by dying to the world, by detachment from the things of earth that we grow and produce spiritual fruit. During the season of Lent, we are detaching ourselves from worldly things by abstinence. Let us be faithful to our Lenten promises so that we might grow spiritually.

Stations of the Cross

Due to the pandemic, we couldn't do Soup and Stations like in previous years. I hope we can do that next year. Nevertheless, we have been able to gather every Friday for the Stations of the Cross. It has been inspiring to see so many people participating every week. The Stations of the Cross is a very special Lenten devotion for Catholics. I often see parishioners praying the stations on their own at church. Lent is almost over, but you can still join on Friday this week.

Reconciliation Service

Lent is a time to be reconciled with God. It is a time to acknowledge that we are sinners in need of God's mercy and forgiveness. We also recognize that we are saved through Jesus who suffered and died for our sins. We will have a Reconciliation Service this coming Tuesday, March 23 at 7:00pm. I know many of you would like to make confession also but due to COVID-19, we encourage parishioners to go to confession at the regularly scheduled time on Saturdays or call the office to make an appointment. We do not want our

priests to be exposed to a large number of people, so we will limit personal confessions after the service to one hour.

Saint Patrick and Saint Joseph

There were two major feasts last week, Saint Patrick's Day (March 17) and Saint Joseph's Day (March 19). Saint Patrick is the patron saint of Ireland. As a missionary, he did a remarkable job spreading the faith and Ireland's conversion to Christianity is attributed to him. You've heard that everyone is Irish on Saint Patrick's Day. I hope you were able to celebrate with family or friends. Saint Joseph is one of the major feasts in the Church. Little is known about Saint Joseph, but his example of faith and humility has inspired people through history. Saint Joseph was the head of the Holy Family, always looking after Mary and Jesus, giving of himself for the sake of his family. Let us follow the example of Saint Joseph by treating others with love and humility.

Springtime

Saint Patrick's Day and Saint Joseph's Day remind us of the new spring season. Days have been warming up and we can feel spring is in the air. This year the vernal equinox falls on March 20. It is the time when night and day are nearly the same length, 12 hours, all over the world. It's called an "equinox," a word derived from Latin, meaning "equal night." It is the time when spring officially starts, although we might get some more cold days here in Chicago. It is also a time of rebirth and renewal. You hear the birds chirping and see the trees coming up to life again. People tend to do spring cleaning around the house. I think it will be a good opportunity for us to do spring cleaning in our hearts, souls, and minds as well.

LIVE THE LITURGY

How do we convince people that God's law is written upon their hearts? God is wedded to God's people. This is a simple and fundamental fact of life. Yet, many ignore this truth and carry on as if they are the center of the universe. As a grain of wheat has to fall to the ground and die in order to become what it really is, we too must die to our secular images and ideas of ourselves so that we can become who God really made us to be. If we kept our focus on God's deep bonded love with each of us, there would be no need to teach others this fundamental life lesson. They would simply know this truth, as Jeremiah tells us. Somehow, perhaps through original and personal sin, we have lost sight of this reality. We have lost our way and our axis. It is time to find our way back, to learn the virtue of obedience, to pay attention to what God is saying and become aware of the Divine Love that is the reason for all creation. Then, even in our darkest hour when all may seem to be lost, we can say as did Jesus, the model of obedience, "Father, glorify your name." By this perseverance, people can come to know the Lord and what God has done.


