

Parables of the Kingdom of God

The gospels often talk about the kingdom of God, but what is the kingdom of God? Jesus wants us to understand it; however, we will not know what it is until we are in it. Our limited human intellect cannot fully grasp the mystery of God's kingdom. This is why Jesus used parables to explain this supernatural reality. Parables are important because they give us a glimpse of the mystery of God and what comes after this life.

A parable is a metaphor from common life that leads the reader to find a deeper meaning in something mysterious. A parable compares a simple picture to an unknown reality. This is why in the gospels, parables start with "The kingdom of God is "like." Parables use common language to describe a reality to be discovered. This is the reason Jesus used parables to help his disciples understand the kingdom of God.

The kingdom of God appears at the heart of Jesus' message. God's kingdom is to rule over the whole world with justice, peace, mercy, and love. The kingdoms of the world do not rule with those values but rather with power, influence, and control. The kingdom of God grows out of God's providence, unlike the kingdoms of the world that grow out of human ambitions. So, Jesus wants his disciples to understand how God's kingdom is to rule over all creation. This Sunday, Jesus tells the parable of the mustard seed.

The Mustard Seed

"To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade."

Jesus' illustration of the kingdom of God helps us to reflect on the process of the kingdom growing in the world from the smallest things to the biggest results that impact the whole world. The mustard seed might be the seed of our faith, sown in the hearts of the faithful. When it grows, it becomes light for others, it becomes a source of peace to others. I think about the mustard seed that has been sown in the hearts of many of our parishioners. There are so many people who have cultivated that seed and now it is the source of God's grace to so many.

The mustard seed, the seed of the kingdom, the seed of faith, has been sown into your heart. It can't help but to grow in your desire to know the Lord. Are you allowing the seed of faith grow? Maybe you are called to do something more with your faith. There are many ministries in the parish that will allow you to grow in your faith. You might consider joining a ministry as a way of being more engaged in your faith. This summer, we will feature ministries in the bulletin. Consider doing something more with your faith, maybe get out of your comfort zone and explore what the Lord and the Church have to offer.

THE 13TH OF JUNE 1917

Fatima, Portugal: Lucia's Words

As soon as Jacinta, Francisco and I had finished praying the Rosary, with a number of other people who were present, we saw once more the flash reflecting the light which was approaching (which we called lightning). The next moment, Our Lady was there on the holmoak, exactly the same as in May.

"What do you want of me?" I asked.

"I wish you to come here on the 13th of next month, to pray the Rosary every day, and to learn to read. Later I will tell you what I want."

I asked for the cure of a sick person.

"If he is converted, he will be cured during the year."

"I would like to ask you to take us to Heaven."

"Yes. I will take Jacinta and Francisco soon. But you are to stay here some time longer. Jesus wishes to make use of you to make me known and loved. He wants to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart. I promise salvation to those who embrace it, and those souls will be loved by God like flowers placed by me to adorn His throne."

"Am I to stay here alone?" I asked sadly.

"No, my daughter. Are you suffering a great deal? Don't lose heart. I will never forsake you. My Immaculate Heart will be your refuge and the way that will lead you to God."
