

NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

For the last couple weeks, we have been reflecting on the bread of life discourse from the gospel of John. Jesus wants us to know that he is the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever. Jesus makes a comparison between "bread," food that sustains our bodies and "him," food that gives life to our souls. Since a person is the union of body and soul, a person cannot be alive without the soul. How do we nourish our bodies? How do we nourish our souls? A body is taken care by food, drink, and sleep. The soul, on the other hand, is taken care by contemplation, prayer, and the sacrament of the Eucharist.

The sacrament of the Eucharist is the food for the soul. It is also the food for eternal life. Whenever we come to be fed spiritually by the Eucharist, we are given the nourishment our souls need for the life to come. It would be a detriment for us to feed only our bodies. We would damage our souls if we would want to find eternal satisfaction in other things rather than the things of God. It takes some time for our bodies to absorb all the nutrients of the food we consume. In the same way, it might take some time for the Eucharist to have some effect on your faith life. But we need to be constant in pursuing the food that last forever.

It is a privilege for all of us to be able to receive the sacrament of the Eucharist. Let us not take for granted what Jesus has given us. He is the bread of life. When we receive his body, our souls are certain to receive eternal life. Every time you come to Mass and receive the sacrament of the Eucharist, think about the well-being of your soul. God wants you to have the food for eternal life.

Renew My Church (RMC)

During the fall, we will continue with the RMC meetings in our grouping. Until then we have the opportunity to hear from some of the committee members. They will share their thoughts and ideas on the process. Here is something from Zeny de Guzman:

Renew My Church, My Reflection

Renew My Church (RMC) is the buzz in the Archdiocese of Chicago and its parishes. At St Catherine Labouré, there have been five articles published in our church bulletin to educate parishioners on what it is all about. Because of the changing landscape in the Catholic faith from a prevalence of Christendom into a New Missionary Age, the Archdiocese of Chicago rolled

out an initiative called "Renew My Church." One of the articles mentioned the parishes being grouped together. SCL is joined with Our Lady of Perpetual Help and St. Norbert/Our Lady of the Brook, understandably as these parishes are geographically close to each other.

One day I was approached by Fr. Lara to be a member of a team he felt could best represent SCL parish to RMC. I was humbled by his request and said yes without fully realizing what a big role I was to be part of. At this point I understood that I am to attend six monthly meetings along with all the parish representatives to work together and share ideas and contribute towards sustainability of each parish. And I thought, "I hope that SCL school will not be closed" which had been a concern of many dedicated parishioners.

After I attended the first meeting, my perspective on RMC changed. From the get-go, it was mentioned that in this Archdiocesan initiative, no changes will be made as far as closing schools or churches or merging parishes. Instead, it was discussed that our RMC journey is both spiritual: to re-encounter Jesus Christ as disciples and parish communities, and structural: to ensure our parishes have adequate resources for vitality. Further, the objective is to create and renew vital and sustainable parishes that have the appropriate vision, leadership, and resources to create an effective culture of evangelization that makes disciples, builds communities, and inspires witnesses. To accomplish this goal, a spiritual director from the archdiocese leads the participants in prayers and faith-based presentations to prepare us to undergo a personal spiritual renewal to better equip and guide us to discern and contribute to the big picture of a renewed church.

As I work along with the RMC SCL team of Bill Attea, Mike LaTona and Ed Harker who are dedicated and active parishioners; Jodi Reuter, SCL school principal; Eileen Mantych, SCL business manager; and Fr. Isaac Lara, our pastor, we pray together that as the chosen ones to this calling, in solidarity with the church groupings, we can make a positive difference for the Renew My Church mission.

LIVE THE LITURGY

If we let God teach us, then we begin to see things and make judgments using a divine lens. Often, we perceive things with purely human eyes and reference points. When we do, reality can lose its divine spark and we miss what God is trying to say. When using human eyes exclusively, Jesus is at best perceived simply as a prophet who has wise things to say. The human element has a difficult time seeing Jesus' divinity and recognizing him as the Bread of Life that comes down from heaven. We can easily get stuck on Jesus' human associations and overlook the marvelous wonders God wants us to see. If we allow God to teach us, we will come to see the truth about Jesus and the abundant everlasting life God offers. Jesus becomes the key that unlocks all of our relationships--with God, others, ourselves, and creation. He, as the true and lasting bread from heaven, shows us the gifts of faith, hope, and love that God bestows on us. Through this divine lens we see that all life sparkles and glows with God's love.







THE 13TH OF AUGUST 1917

Fatima, Portugal: Lucia's Words

On the 13th of August, the magistrate kidnapped Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco, taking them to Ourém.

On the following Sunday, the 19th of August, the children, according to their custom, went to the Cova da Iria after Mass. There they said the Rosary, then returned to Aljustrel. After lunch, Lucia, together with Francisco and his elder brother John, left for a place called Valinhos. The afternoon passed quickly, but towards four o'clock, Lucia became aware of the signs that always immediately preceded the apparitions of Our Lady...and Jacinta was not there! Lucia called out to John, "Go quickly and get Jacinta! Our Lady is coming!" John bolted off to get her...hand in hand, they raced over to Valinhos so as not to miss Our Lady...A few moments later, the brilliant Lady appeared over a holm oak. The Lady was rewarding the children for their fidelity.

"What do you want of me?" Lucia asked.

"I want you to continue to come to the Cova da Iria on the thirteenth and to continue to say the Rosary every day."

Lucia then told Our Lady of her anguish that so many disbelieved in the reality of Her presence. She asked Our Lady if She would be willing to perform a miracle so that all might see and believe.

"Yes" Our Lady answered, "In the last month, in October, I shall perform a miracle so that all may believe in My apparitions..."

Lucia then spoke to Our Lady of the sick who had been recommended to her.

"Yes, I shall cure some of them within a year." But She went on teaching them to pray rather for the health of souls than of bodies, "Pray! Pray a great deal and make sacrifices for sinners, for many souls go to Hell because they have no one to pray and make sacrifices for them."






