

ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The Church invites us to celebrate in a special way some significant aspects of our faith. Some of those moments are so important that we are asked to celebrate with the universal Church in the sacrament of the Eucharist. These are called holy days of obligation. Holy days of obligation are opportunities for us to celebrate our faith with the rest of the Church. Holy days of obligation are, rather, a privilege we have. They help us to reflect on what we believe and give thanks to God for his love for the world. Here are the holy days of obligation we observe:

- The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, January 1
- The Solemnity of the Ascension, Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter
- The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, August 15
- The Solemnity of All Saints, November 1
- The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, December 8
- The Solemnity of the Nativity of Jesus or Christmas, December 25

This year, August 15 falls on a Sunday, so we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on the Day of the Lord. The obligation to come to Mass on Sunday will be the same as coming to celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption. Also, in the years when the Assumption falls on a Saturday or a Monday, it is not obligatory to attend Mass since the faithful will participate in the sacrament of the Eucharist on Sunday. This was amended in the Church calendar by the US bishops. Even in those years, it is important for all the faithful to celebrate the solemnity of the Assumption. Next year, August 15 will be a Monday. I invite you to plan on coming to Church even though it is not required for you to attend. Remember, it is a privilege that we have to celebrate the mysteries of our faith.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrates Mary assumed body and soul into heaven. Mary was conceived without sin; she became the Mother of God; she was the perfect tabernacle for Jesus, the Son of God. So, by

virtue of her most pure soul and heart, she was privileged to be brought up to heaven body and soul. Mary is the one who responded to the love of God by giving herself totally to God. She is the new Eve for by one woman sin came into the world and by one woman salvation was restored to humankind.

The Assumption of Mary doesn't only celebrate the fact that Mary was taken up to heaven, it also gives us a glimpse of our destiny in heaven. Mary's purity prevented her body from decay since that is the sign and consequence of sin. Mary's immaculate body needed to be taken from this earthly life to heaven as a sign of our hope in eternal life. So Mary's assumption gives us hope for eternal life. This mystery turns our eyes to the direction of life in heaven. "Who wants to go to heaven?" Father Murphy used to ask. You and I, and Mary and Jesus will be there waiting for us.

College students are moving back to college; grade schools and high schools are ready to start the new school year. The teachers and staff at SCL have been working hard to make sure we start off on the right foot this new school year. 
