

TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile.”

Purification seems to be a ritual human beings naturally observe. We often hear of people going on diets to cleanse or purify their bodies from toxins or chemicals that might harm their health. Those practices can be rather challenging since they require discipline and resilience. People are willing to go through a process of purification because they want to have a healthy body. A similar ritual takes place when people want to quit an addiction. Very often, it is an excruciating process for the individual who is too dependent on something, such as drugs, gambling, alcohol, sex, social media, gossip, etc. We want to purify our minds and hearts of the corruptions of the world. Rituals of purification and cleansing are also prevalent in the Church. We talk about purifying our souls, hearts, and minds before we receive a sacrament. In fact, the sacrament of confession serves as a means of purifying our souls. Purification rituals seem to be something we value and try to observe as best as we can to be in a good and healthy state of mind, body, and spirit.

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus talks about the purification rituals religious leaders used to observe. It appears as though Jesus is telling the scribes and pharisees that these rituals are not important. “Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile.” Jesus is not saying that rituals are not important; he is referring to the purpose of rituals. Rituals are the means to achieve a higher goal. Jesus admonishes the Scribes and Pharisees for making the rituals more important than their purpose. There is no ritual that will purify our hearts if we are not willing to work at it. There is no ritual that will make someone's soul perfect if they are not willing to interiorize the meaning of their actions.

How does a heart become pure? How does a soul become holy? How does a mind become healthy? It is by what the person is willing to keep inside. Once good things are stored in the heart, mind, and soul, we will only give what is good, truthful, and beautiful. Rituals of purification help us to cleanse

ourselves as long as we are willing to do the work. “Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile.”

Ministers of Care

Last week, some ministers of care from our grouping met at OLPH. This ministry has been affected greatly by the pandemic. For a period of time, ministers of care were not able to visit parishioners who are homebound nor patients at nursing homes and hospitals. This summer, when cases slowed down, some ministers of care resumed their visits but recently many of the local facilities have placed new restrictions because of the uncertainty of virus. We continue praying for the sick and infirm and hope to be able to resume this ministry soon. Thanks to Zeny de Guzman for her leadership at SCL and her work with the parishes in our grouping.

Renew My Church

We have resumed RMC meetings for our grouping. Last Tuesday, we hosted a meeting here for our “Glenbrook” grouping: Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Saint Norbert/Our Lady of the Brook, and Saint Catherine Labouré. The archdiocesan team and the committees from our three parishes continue to reflect on the need for renewal in the Church and specifically in our local communities. We will keep you informed about the RMC process. Keep the three parishes in our grouping in your prayers.

Last Friday, Cardinal Cupich met with all the groupings in the archdiocese going through Renew My Church. He emphasized his support to the pastors and discernment teams from all parishes. The goal of the Archdiocese of Chicago is to have vital and sustainable parishes that can continue with the mission of sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ with all in a more effective way. There have been some closures and mergers in other parts of the archdiocese. These decisions will help the rest of the archdiocese to be stronger in its mission. Pray for all parishes in the archdiocese, especially those that are going through Renew My Church.




