



"If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all."

Who is a servant?

Saint Paul thought of a servant as someone who is free to act within the bounds of God's will. The call to be a servant is not only for members of religious orders or bishops or priests who minister to the spiritual needs of the Church. This calling includes more than just public servants who work for the well-being of society. Public officials are the most obvious examples of service but everyone is called to be a servant. Jesus encourages us to love one another, in other words to serve one another.

What are the qualities of a servant?

A good servant is committed to the work that needs to be done for the well-being of all. Commitment is a quality that makes the mission stronger. Commitment is necessary for a servant leader. Challenges are inevitable but committed servants work through difficult times to make things happen. Jesus is calling us to be committed servants to our families and our Church. What is your level of commitment to your family? What is your level of commitment to the Church? We need to renew our sense of commitment as servants to all. If we want to be first in the kingdom of God, we need to be servants.

Compassion is an essential quality of those who serve. Compassion is the ability to understand someone else's feelings, emotions, fears, and suffering. If we want to be effective servants to others, compassion is necessary. Only by understanding someone else's position are we able to help with their needs. Are you compassionate toward others? How well do you listen to other people's needs? It is by being compassionate that we become better servants to others.

Honesty is a quality good servants need to have. Honesty is about speaking and acting truthfully. Honesty is an act of respect for others. Servants, out of the goodness of their hearts, treat others with truthfulness. An honest person serves best when words and actions are in harmony with each other. Do you always act with honesty and integrity? Are you truthful to yourself and others in what you say and do?

Humility is a key element for a servant. Humility is the ability to recognize who we are before God and others. Humble people know the roles they are to take in God's creation. A humble servant understands that it is not about one's own success, desires, wants, or needs. It is about others' needs because through them, we find gratification and God's presence. Do you place others' needs before your own desires? Are you an example of humility to others?

Religious Education

We are off to a good start with the religious education program at SCL. All the students and catechists were looking forward to the new year. Last Sunday was the first day of classes, busy with all the students finding their classrooms. I would like to thank Sara DiCesare, our new Religious Education Coordinator and all the catechists for their hard work in getting ready for this year. Renew My Church

We need to be reminded that the Renew My Church process is more than just a structural change in parishes around the Archdiocese of Chicago. Renew My Church is more about the spiritual renewal that needs to happen in our hearts. This process reminds us that we need to follow Jesus, so that in becoming his disciples we can transform our Church. This process is modeled after Saint Francis of Assisi's call before the Saint Damiano Cross: "Go repair my church." St. Francis eventually understood that Jesus was calling him to rebuild the spiritual life and vitality of the entire Church. Likewise, we need to see that the renewal of the Catholic Church starts within us. Pray for the Renew My Church process in our grouping; a brighter future for the Church in Glenview, Northbrook, and the Archdiocese of Chicago is coming.

What does it mean to be God's servant? In essence, it means being willing to call the world back to its childlike innocence, showing all that a joy-filled playfulness has a place in life. It is a kingdom devoid of jealousy and selfish ambition where peace, gentleness, mercy, and good works abound. The prayer of this kind of servant is not focused on self-advancement or need. Rather, the servant's prayer seeks to detach from self-concern in order to be used by God. In this way, we who are servants can be inspired, guided, empowered, and led by God. We can then be used to lay the cornerstones of the kingdom: faith, hope, and love. It is upon these that God's firm dwelling is built. Accepting this call may place us last in the world's eyes but first in God's.

RENEW MY CHURCH:

EVANGELIZATION OF OUR CATHOLIC FAITH

Having been assured that the three parishes in our grouping will continue as separate parishes, the focus of our Renew My Church team turns to Evangelization--to share our Catholic faith with others. What is it that Jesus asked his apostles to share? Nothing more than the mystery of faith.

"The mystery of faith" What is faith? A dictionary defines faith as "belief and trust in and loyalty to God; belief in the traditional doctrines of a religion; firm belief on something for which there is no proof; and complete trust." As Catholics, we can accept all of these definitions. But so can adherents to almost every religious sect in the world. Whether one believes in God, Allah, The Almighty, Jehovah, or any other deity, one has faith.

So what separates Catholics from others who have faith? The mystery of faith--the belief in transubstantiation which changes the substance of bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ. At the Last Supper with his apostles, "while they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, 'Take and eat, this is My body.' Then He took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, 'Drink from it, all of you, for this is My blood of the covenant, which shall be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins'" (Mt 26:26-28). The day after Jesus fed the multitudes with five loaves and two fish, He said, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." and "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you" (Jn 6:51-56).

Our Catholic faith is based on the belief that Jesus, through His apostles and those ordained to priesthood since then, shares His Body and Blood each time we receive communion. During the consecration at Mass, through transubstantiation, the bread and wine become the body and blood of Christ that nourish us and help us heed God's two greatest commandments: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." and "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Mk 12:29-31).

Faith, our belief that Jesus is with us in the Eucharist to love with our heart, soul, mind and strength; Hope, our belief that by doing this, Jesus will provide us with eternal life with Him; and Love, the treatment of our neighbors as we would hope others would treat us.






