

FR. LARA'S LINES

CORPUS CHRISTI

Last week, the Church celebrated the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. We reflected on the mystery of God in three persons: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. God loves his creation perfectly and desires it to share in his divine glory. This loving God came into the world in the flesh. It is Jesus, fully God and fully human, whose mission was to bring back to God the straying humanity. Christ's work of redemption is the paschal mystery, Jesus' passion, death, resurrection, and ascension into heaven. Although Jesus ascends into heaven, he does stay with the Church in the sacrament of the Eucharist. The gospel of John speaks of this: "Jesus said, I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh... those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them... this is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever."

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi venerates the real presence of Christ in the sacrament of the Eucharist. The Church is nourished by the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The Divine Word was made flesh in Jesus, and his divinity was made manifest in Jesus himself. The Eucharist is at the center of Catholic life because the real presence of the divine is in this sacrament. At the celebration of the Eucharist, the bread and wine are transformed into the body and blood of Jesus. We partake in the timeless celebration of the Last Supper which Jesus shared with his disciples. He gave himself to his disciples as nourishment for eternal life. Jesus is the bread for eternal life. The Second Vatican Council states that the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. Jesus needs to be at the center of our lives since in the presence of Jesus, we can continue with our mission to transform the world.

National Eucharistic Revival

The Church wants the faithful to understand the meaning and importance of the Eucharist. In recent times, the culture seems to label the Eucharist as a mere symbol, but it is the real presence of Jesus. There needs to be a deeper understanding of what the Eucharist means. This will help us deepen our relationship with God and appreciate the importance of the sacramental life of the Church.

The US Conference of the Catholic Bishops saw the need to foster a deeper devotion to the Eucharist. The National Eucharistic Revival is the result of the USCCB's commitment to have the Eucharist at the center of the Church in America. The purpose is to come to a fuller understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist as the source and summit of the Christian life. The Church wants the faithful to take part in the celebration of the sacrament and to deepen their relationships with God. The Eucharistic Revival has been taking place in parishes and dioceses all around the US. All parishes are invited to pray and celebrate the sacrament of the Eucharist. I invite you to come to Mass more often this summer. The Eucharistic Revival starts and ends in the hearts of believers; it is the realization that the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life.

This Is My Body

A friend once asked me why I wore a Crucifix around my neck. She was a Christian and very devout, so I was surprised at her confusion. "To remember Jesus' sacrifice," I said.

Her upper lip curled in disgust. "The cross is a sign of Jesus' sacrifice," she said. "He's not on the cross anymore. It's really weird that you wear his dead body."

As someone raised Catholic, the Corpus was an image I knew intimately. We had Crucifixes all over our home. And I actually preferred them over the plain crosses I saw elsewhere—the Crucifixes felt more complete.

My friend's disgust compelled me to reflect, on the image of Christ's body, wounded and twisted and tortured. Why did this visual compel me? It didn't make a lot of sense for someone who found it difficult to look into a casket at a wake. So, what was different about this?

My friend wasn't wrong: Christ is no longer on the cross. The sacrifice has been made. But does that mean it is over? We re-present it every single Mass. It's the point of everything that we do. Jesus did not sacrifice his spirit; he sacrificed his body. He bought us with every tear of the flesh, with every drop of blood.

The cross is crucial, yes. But that wood didn't bleed for us. If the body wasn't the point, Jesus would not have become human at all. Jesus needed the body.

We need it, too.

"While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, 'Take it; this is my body.' — Matthew 26:26






