2nd SUNDAY OF LENT

Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. - Mk 9:2-3

Second Sunday of Lent

A pregnant woman was walking in the store and met an old friend. Her friend exclaimed, "You are absolutely beaming!" The new life God placed in her womb radiated throughout her body. It was brightly visible on her face and in her eyes. Transformation and change usually happen from the inside out. It is very rare that simply imposing structure from the outside does any good. Yes, it is true that routines and habits can change when things are done differently. But, for this change to last there has to be an interior renewal and metamorphosis as well. Simply regulating behavior and bringing someone into conformity with accepted protocols doesn't mean their heart and soul come with them.

Peter was a homeless man who lived in a very remote and rudimentary tent community. He was happy to make his daily trip to McDonald's and always welcomed a gift card or two so that he could buy some coffee and something to eat. A generous advocate worked to secure him an apartment in hopes of moving Peter out of his makeshift housing and into something safer. Peter finally got the grand tour of his new "digs," received his own key, remarked how wonderful the place was, closed the door behind him when they left and never returned. He preferred his tent. No matter how much things changed on the outside, Peter was happy where he was. A poignant lesson was learned that day.

How is your Lent going? By now you ought to have a sense of whether you're really "into it" this year and something transformational is happening. For many, it's only the stuff on the outside that changes for a few weeks and then they return to business as usual. For others, there are some real inner changes happening that are deepening their relationships with God, others, self, and creation. If we are serious about moving to a new place and radiating with the presence of new life and joy, then we have to clear the way to listen for God's call. Then, there is God's request to change things up a bit and order our lives differently. After realizing we have been called and given a mission, we have to trust that this is where we need to be. And then, after all of this hard work we are asked to act. The fruit that is revealed will indicate whether our journey is authentic. The brilliance of conversion will begin to shine on our faces as we contemplate the One to whom we are asked to listen.

*From Father Paul's desk...***Spiritual Reading**

It sounds like many of you are enjoying the Consecration to St. Joseph. The books that Father Nicholas provided went fast and I even gave up my own copy for a parishioner! I have been doing a bit of spiritual reading during Lent and cut back on TV and internet time to get more done. The latest book I am working on is about the Marian apparitions at Fatima.

On May 13, 1917, and in each subsequent month until October of that year, three young peasant children, Lucia dos Santos and her cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto, reportedly saw a woman who identified herself as the Lady of the Rosary. The lady (the Virgin Mary), encouraged everyone to pray the Rosary and do penance so that sinners may be saved from the fires of Hell. In particular, she warned against the "errors of Russia" that would spread and cause much disaster around the world. However, in the end, her Immaculate Heart would triumph. It is unfortunate that it seems the "errors of Russia" have spread; not just in the persecution of the Church under communism, but also in the atheistic, materialistic society of the West. Though accomplished in different ways, the ultimate error is the sad belief that God does not exist and there is no use in prayer. Now more than ever we should commit ourselves to praying the rosary and doing penance for sin, asking God to convert sinners and save souls in danger of going to Hell.

One question that had been bothering me about this apparition was "why did Mary appear to shepherd children? Why not appear to kings and bishops with this message?" The author of the book I am reading helped to provide an answer. The community in which these children lived was profoundly religious. They had holy pastors, sang religious songs, attended Mass frequently, and memorized their catechism before first communion! In short, the nation of Portugal had a robust Catholic culture that was able to produce children capable of receiving such a vision. In our fast-paced, materialistic culture would any of us even notice the Blessed Mother if she appeared? I would suggest that it is high time we started to rebuild this Catholic culture so that we can hear the voice of God and our Blessed Mother just as those children did. Slow down, pray, study your faith, and remove all those things in your life which are making you blind and deaf to the grace of God. Our Lady is speaking to us even now with words of peace. Let us open our ears and listen!

LENTEN DISCIPLINES

The Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are not to be taken lightly. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast. On days of fast, one full meal and two lesser meals are allowed. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are bound to fast. Ash Wednesday and all of the Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat may not be taken. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years of age or older. If members of the Faithful are unable to observe fast and abstinence regulations due to ill health or other reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of penance and self-denial suitable to their condition.
