Fifth Sunday of Easter

“Spiraling out of control,” is a phrase that can easily describe the current display of human existence. In addition to the violence, unrest, uneasiness and turmoil that are common elements of our daily news, other essential pieces are misplaced or missing. Many lack an objective center around which to order and structure their lives or a clear set of definable goals or mores to act as guideposts and life directives. It appears that “feelings” have become a “new god” and traditional structures and ideals set aside. It is almost as if history only shows that we got this whole thing wrong and many are determined to finally set things right. The real truth, however, is that while wrongs and errors are certainly a part of our often-checked past, it is hardly the case that all was wrong. It is not our task to rewrite the history of our lives, but to learn from mistakes that were made, and preserve the perennial wisdom at the root of our successes. Learning is an essential part of being human.

The question becomes, however, from whom do we learn? Some have such a hard time placing God in that position, but that is precisely where God needs to be. God is the Master Teacher from whom all of humanity learns and gets its cues. It is in and through this relationship with the Gardener of Life that we are fashioned and pruned into the people we are intended to be and can be. It is only in God that we are able to find our best selves. Sadly, many think that religion too, as well as history in general, has also gotten all this wrong. Yet, our resurrection faith tells us differently. We are reminded, today especially, that we are meant to remain in Christ as Christ remains in us. We are also reminded that Jesus, the Incarnate God, is the vine upon which we grow, the branches that flow from the source of God’s life.

Giving up our will to God’s can be a painful endeavor. It is not easy to set our own desires and wants aside and allow God to step in and direct and guide our growth. But this is the only way to prevent deadly weeds from overtaking us and bringing us to a place of self-destruction. God’s commandments are the very guideposts and benchmarks we need, yet many seek to remove them from all public view because they appear to limit self-expression and suppress what is considered by many to be “human freedom.” They are the only way we can find freedom, however. And, until we learn this fundamental lesson, we will continue to spiral out of control, never really knowing who we are, what our potential can be or how life really can be lived. From Father Paul's desk...

Long Range Planning Questions and Feedback

As of writing this article, I have conducted two long range planning sessions with the parishes. The first two were held at Holy Family. There were lots of good comments and questions, so I thought it would be a good idea to relate them to you.

—First, there were a series of questions about the number of clergy and the number of parishes. While we do have a number of good men in the seminary now, the number of clergy retirements will outpace the number of ordinations for many years to come. We must pray and encourage vocations as this is the clearest solution to the problems facing many of our parishes. More priests means better pastoral care and stronger parishes. If numbers continue as they are, it will be several decades before the number of active clergy begins to grow. It is highly likely that the parishes on the West side of Scott County will see one or two less priests in the next few years.—A number of questions related to population growth. If we take 2020 out of the mix, most of our parishes saw a decline in attendance but were beginning to level off or rise before Covid. St. Peter's in Buffalo continues to grow as does our Latin Mass community. There are large numbers of people who are registered but do not regularly attend Mass. These are typically younger families with children in our schools. Since these folks represent the future of our parish, it is critically important that we reach out to them and increase their involvement in parish life.—If we were to build a new parish church to serve West Scott County, it would include a number of features we are currently lacking. These would include: better handicapped access, convenient parking, a capacious parish hall, modern bathrooms, and a state-of-the-art school. Most people seemed to favor building a church that looks like a church. Many of our current sanctuary appointments could be brought with us to outfit the new structure. Many people were concerned about what might happen to our old churches. I am not in favor of demolishing or closing churches. Hopefully we can find ways to maintain our worship sites as churches or at least repurpose them in a way that is consistent with ministry and respectful of their history.—So far everyone has agreed that a study is in order. I will begin the selection process for a company to come in and make a feasibility study so that we can better gauge the interest in moving forward with a new plan. It is highly likely that we will either consolidate or build in the near future. Please pray that we make the right decisions and that God will bless our plans!

Common questions about the Traditional Latin Mass:

What does the term “assisting at Mass” mean? This term has been used for many years, but has fallen by the wayside since the 1970s. You will hear people attending the Extraordinary Form use it to describe what they do when attending Mass. The term could equally be used to describe attending the Novus Ordo. The theological meaning of the sacred priesthood is manifold, but a central point is that a man is ordained a priest specifically to offer sacrifice. In the Catholic religion that means the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass where the priest immolates the Sacred Victim (Christ) in an unbloody manner at the altar during the Consecration. The laity “assist” at Mass not in that they “help” the priest because the priest needs no “help” - that is not the meaning of “assist.” Rather it means to participate mentally, spiritually, and physically in the sacred mysteries in the role proper to the non-ordained. Another way to say it is that the laity, through the sacrament of Baptism, are consecrated to a common, holy priesthood. By virtue of this sacrament we share in the priesthood of Christ and along with the ordained priest at Mass we offer the Divine Victim to the Father. We offer ourselves as members of Christ mystical body as well. All the Faithful, both the immolating priest and the laity assisting, join ranks in completing the Holy Sacrifice by the priestly action of consuming the Victim through reception of Holy Communion.






SOCIAL ACTION CORNER
