“To what shall we compare the kingdom of God? It is like a mustard seed ... once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants.” - Mk 4:30a, 31a, 32

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

A favorite motto of St. Teresa of Calcutta was, “do small things with great love.” This is how it works in the kingdom of God. God can do tremendous things with the smallest gesture, especially when it is done in love. We can clearly see that our world is suffering greatly. People are struggling to find peace, navigate through conflicts, earn a sustainable living, find security and enough food to eat, and work through political tensions and conflicts. In the light of the magnitude of the difficulties that exist around us and even within us, we can find ourselves floundering to discover practical, effective solutions. How can something so large be helped by someone as small and seemingly insignificant as me? While whole systems and structures may be out of the league of our personal influence, are we really that helpless in the midst of all of the turmoil, sadness, and suffering?

If we believe that God is with us and that God is still working to bring about the glory of God’s kingdom, then the answer is no. We are never helpless or without hope. Armed with a strong life of prayer, we can always flee to God and ask for inspiration, wisdom, and especially love. We are all blessed with unique gifts and talents and it often seems that considering all that the world lacks, love and charity remain at the top of the list. Life can easily become a battleground of hostility. Because life is challenging and difficult, anger is not far away. We see it on people’s faces and hear it in their voices. There is a measure of frustration that permeates all avenues of life. It is even felt in the air.

As people of faith, we know that what we see here is not the end but only a part of something far greater to come. We know that God’s kingdom is where we are ultimately meant to be, and the Gospel is the way to get there. If love and charity can prevail in us, then God will be able to do what God does best. God will use us to scatter the seeds of his kingdom. Through our small gestures, those seeds can receive the nurturing attention that is necessary for them to bear great fruit. We cannot fall victim to the strife that is around us. We have to keep ourselves refreshed and focused so that even in small ways, we can become part of the solution, not the problem. From Father Paul's desk...

Parish Involvement

Now that COVID restrictions have loosened to a great degree, it is time to get back to Church! Parish involvement encompasses a lot of different things, but it always starts with Holy Mass. Catholics are bound by the Sunday obligation, but going to Mass should be your greatest joy. This is our primary way to pray, worship, and adore the One who made us. All graces and divine gifts flow from the Eucharist, so Catholics should attend the Mass as often as possible. It is likely that our diocese will soon lift the permission to miss Mass on Sunday, so it is a good idea to get back in the routine now.

Once you have encountered God at Mass, you have established a firm foundation. Now it is up to you to build on that foundation through private prayer and works of charity. There are any number of clubs, groups, or commissions to join in all of our churches. There is the Altar and Rosary, Legion of Mary, Knights of Columbus, youth group, choir, prayer shawl group and bazaar workshop group. If this isn't enough, then perhaps God is calling you to start something new! Don't wait for someone else to tell you what to do, find a need and fix it! For my part, I will be starting a study group on Wednesday nights at St. Al's. We will be going over the Baltimore Catechism and recording the classes so they can go on YouTube. I especially encourage all of our Religious Education catechists and Catholic school teachers to attend or watch online once they are posted. The Baltimore Catechism explains in a thorough but simple fashion the most important elements of our faith and can help you in those difficult conversations with non-believers.

I believe strongly that we can create the sort of community we want to live in. In fact, we have been doing this for decades. We now see the fruit of abandoning religion, destroying marriage, playing profanity on the airwaves, and teaching modernist principles in school. Violence in our community is a direct result of abandoning better standards in our society. If you want to make a difference here in the QCA, do something different today and bring your family with you.

October 4-15, 2021




Dear Friends,

NEW COVID-19 GUIDELINES FOR MASS:

In the front section of the church, pews are no longer roped off. In the back section, some of the pews will still be roped off.

Masks and social distancing are not required by anyone who is vaccinated.

Missalettes and hymnals may be used.

Music ministry (cantor, choir, all instruments) is permitted if the ministers have been vaccinated.

Congregational singing is permitted.

The use of readers is permitted.

The use of altar servers is permitted.

Liturgies should be kept to a reasonable length and not unduly prolonged.

Communion on the tongue is permitted to those who have been vaccinated. Those who are unvaccinated and wish to receive on the tongue should present themselves at the end of the communion line.


