

Third Sunday of Lent

When I became the pastor of a large parish, I soon found myself, for the first time in my life, riddled with anxiety, headaches, difficulty making decisions, and fatigue. I called a therapist friend and told her my symptoms and asked if she thought I needed a serious medical exam. She said, "How much water do you drink?" I told her, "I haven't had time to drink water lately." She responded, "You're chronically dehydrated. Drink eighty-five ounces a day and call me in a week." I started guzzling water and in a week all my symptoms went away. I felt great.

Like me, the people in the Exodus wanderings were dehydrated. But unlike me, they knew it. Their symptoms were bad. They fight with each other. They accuse God of being a monster who wants them and their children to die of thirst. Their thirst drives them to plot the bloody assassination of the man who rescued them. God responds by using Moses to strike a rock from which rivers of living waters flow to quench their thirst for years to come.

The Holy Spirit is the living water of love which flows from the pierced side of Jesus, the new Moses. What symptoms in your life suggest you're spiritually dehydrated? Anger at God? Cynicism at your leaders? Bitter rivalry and bickering with others? Don't panic. Of course we have those symptoms. Ask God to provide his water to quench your spiritual thirst, and he will. And all those symptoms will soon disappear. — Father John Muir **©LPi**



From Father Nicholas' desk...

Truth and Mercy Series XL

Before the Lord Jesus Christ departed the world to His father and ours, he said clearly, "Go and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. And know that I will be with you always until the end of time." (Matthew 28: 18-20). This injunction or mandate is for all times and a sacred commission to the whole Church. It is also simply addressed to the apostles and disciples of Jesus Christ for all ages, including ours. This assignment belongs to all members of the church, young and old alike. It belongs to laity, religious and clergy. All the segments of the people of God have a unique role to strategize, mobilize and work with the power of the Holy Spirit to carry out this sacred task.

As your pastor, it is also my responsibility to make sure that we carry this out in our parish under the direction of our Bishop. We have to reach every member of our community, beginning with the children and youth. They are very much a priority today going by the kind of world they are growing in. The secular world is throwing a lot at them and we must walk with them with the light of Christ to dispel the cloud of unbelief. It is with this at heart that our vision is being concretized by the new hiring we have done. We now have a Director for Children's Ministry in the person of Sr. Anne-Marie Aremu SSMA. She will direct the task of helping our kids grow in holiness. She will help them bring out their creativity in God's manifold ways. She will help train volunteers to make our children enjoy the liturgy of the word in their appropriate language suited to their age. All kids, from toddlers to 5th grade, will be under her care. After these, come our 6th to 11th graders. Hieu Nguyen, whom you met already, will be their animator. We need to embrace youth events like Bible studies, indoor and outdoor games, Family Bible breakfast, Youth night, movie evenings and more. We have lined up a St. Philomena Academy (Youth camp) on August 11th-13th for them. Please, we encourage parents and families to get ready. This will be so cool. If you need more information with regards to this academy please contact, Hieu or Vickie (at St. Alphonsus). If you would like to volunteer or have ideas please reach out to them as well. We have also hired a second nun named Sr. Damiana Adevingbo SSMA. She is our new Director of Faith Formation in the parish. Her responsibilities will include adult faith formation, training catechists for our religious education program, training and retraining our extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, readers and ushers. She will help with marriage and family related matters in the parish as well.

This is what I call "missio ad intra!" This is the way to go about evangelization and setting our hearts on fire. Without that, we cannot go out to the "missio ad extra." Our mission as a parish is to get each one to heaven. We desire a community that knows her faith and is able to carry it out, because "we cannot give what we do not have." In the coming weeks we shall have what I call our "Parish Pastoral Congress" during the weekend of April 21-22, 2023. Please watch for more details. It suffices to say at this moment that the theme is: "My people perish for lack of knowledge." (Hosea 4:6).

LENTEN DISCIPLINES

The Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are not to be taken lightly. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast. On days of fast, one full meal and two lesser meals are allowed. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are bound to fast. Ash Wednesday and all of the Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat may not be taken. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years of age or older. If members of the Faithful are unable to observe fast and abstinence regulations due to ill health or other reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of penance and self-denial suitable to their condition.

***Bishop Zinkula's St. Patrick's Day Dispensation: All Catholics of the Diocese of Davenport, no matter where they may be, and all other Catholics present in the Diocese on that day, are dispensed from the obligation to abstain from meat (can. 87 §1). It is not required that anyone make use of this dispensation. Those who do wish to make use of it are encouraged to abstain from meat on some other day as part of their penitential practices during Lent.

Diocesan campaign coming to our parish!

The *Upon This Rock* Campaign is the Diocese of Davenport's effort to raise \$28 million for three important goals:

To increase funding for the health care and retirement needs of our priests To cover seminarians' education costs

To benefit every parish in the diocese

Our parish is in Wave 3 of parishes participating in the campaign. We're in the preparation phase of our campaign, and we'll kick off the public phase this spring. In the meantime, each week we will be publishing a few Frequently Asked Questions about the campaign. A compilation of all the FAQs is available at davenportdiocese.org/campaign.

What is a capital campaign?

A capital campaign is an effort to raise money in a fairly short period of time to pay for a significant project or build up a large fund for future use. For a Catholic diocese or parish, this refers to gifts and pledges over and above parishioners' regular giving to the Sunday collection or to the Annual Diocesan Appeal. Parishioners who make pledges to the Diocese of Davenport's campaign will have three years to fulfill their commitment.

Who will be asked to give?

Over the course of the campaign, every household in every parish in the diocese will be asked to make a sacrificial gift.

When will the campaign take place?

Preparations for the campaign began in September 2021, and the active campaign is taking place in three waves, the last of which will conclude in mid-2023.
