Recently I was with my little dog Libby at a retreat center in the Arizona desert. I sat in a chair near a ravine filled with shrubs. Unbeknownst to me, Libby wandered down there and disappeared. Suddenly an animal's wild shriek erupted from the area. Without thinking, I bolted down into the ravine fully expecting to see coyotes, javelinas, or rattlesnakes. I didn't care. I desperately wanted to get Libby out of there, without any self-regard. Before I could face whatever danger lay hidden, my dog blissfully trotted out from an entirely different area, utterly unaware that I had (quite heroically) just placed my life on the line.

When the adrenaline wore off, I thought to myself: how far would I have been willing to go to save her? I don't know. But I do know, if I had literally died, my friends and family would have certainly thought me insane for dying for a dog. No offense, Libby.

How passionately Jesus wants us to know him and his willingness to die for us! This week he says, **"I know my own and my own know me,"** and **"I lay down my life for the sheep."** Here we encounter an insanely excessive love for us. Christianity is a relationship and not simply a religion or ethical code. In Jesus, God rescues and saves us. He laid down his life for you and me — and he has taken it up again. So often we are like Libby — blissfully ignorant of the reality of both our spiritual danger and his saving love. This Easter season, the risen Jesus calls us to be more conscious than ever before about his love. He never ceases to lay down his life for us.

From Father Nicholas' desk... Truth and Mercy Series

I have shared a story some time ago about almost giving up my seminary training and abandoning the call to the priesthood in relation to a crisis I was facing. This was between my philosophy studies and the beginning of theology. I had already secured a Bachelor's in Philosophy, so that was also very tempting. I had perceived that I was being unjustly treated and felt the only way to express my grievance was to quit. I saw myself having to suffer for a "perceived" wrong done by someone else. I could not stomach that since I felt the other should ordinarily suffer for his wrong doing. I remember speaking to a seminarian friend then who mentioned to me that "Jesus did not commit any sin but He was chosen to suffer for every sinner in the world." This was very touching to me but I wondered if this truly what I was going through? Why was it me to go through this rough patch?

God gave me more insights that night while I had already made up my mind to quit no matter what. I was preparing a "sermon" for the people of God in that local "outstation" (a community without a pastor). My plan was that after that church service, I will depart finally to speak with the pastor living far away of my intention to quit. This community was named St. Mary's Church, Oranre. It was the eve of the Epiphany. I was in a crisis situation and truly that is when we need a star to guide us like the Magi needed one desperately to their mission and goal. Now steeped in the WORD of God, the commentary showed me that every crisis should ultimately lead us to find God and not away from him. This is because the crisis itself was an opportunity to step back, reflect and see what God is calling us to. Crisis is a wake-up call to properly situate us. This takes me back to the call of Moses. He saw the "burning bush" it was a sight unusual because the bush was burning but not consumed (Exodus 3: 1-10). This unusual occurrence was a wake-up call for Moses to begin a conversation with God, leading him ultimately to his choice as the leader to liberate his chosen people, Israel.

What has been your relationship with injustice, or crisis or even strange occurrences? Are you the one who analyzes issues based on the ordinary or pervious understanding? Have you at any time tried to figure it out with earthly wisdom or counsel? Do you ever look up to heaven for spiritual counsel or guide? A crisis or injustice situation can send us into a panic mode. We might lose our path or even the God-given plan for us if we turn the wrong way in navigating the situation. The WORD of God is a cure guide in all situations. The WORD of God is Jesus Christ. He is the one we seek in all situations. In a crisis situation God says to us, "I lift up my eyes to the mountains—from where shall come my help? My help comes from the Lord, the maker of heaven and earth. He will not let your foot slip; he watches over you and will not slumber.. The Lord is your guardian; the Lord is your shade at your right hand... The Lord will guard you from evil; he will protect your life." (Psalm 121: 1-7). These words give me chills reading them knowing that they never fail at all.

The WORD of God is not fables at all. "These WORDS are Spirit and life". When we reflect on them during times of temptation, tribulation or trials they give us new life and we are imbued with the spirit of God to see his path for us in a clear manner. During the crucifixion of the Lord, the devil and his cohorts felt they were already exterminating him. They truly believed his life was coming to an end. They felt what was going to become of all his speeches, his plans. It was going to be the "end" of their perceived enemy. But since the WORD of God never fails, he roared from the grave on the third day: he ROSE from the dead. He vanquished the foes and brought us VICTORY. When we follow the promptings of the WORD of God in our lives rather than the words of men, we live. In fact, we triumph like our Savior and Messiah because he is the WORD of God made man for us. He is the STAR we need to illuminate, the darkness crisis plunges us into. The Good NEWS is that you have been set free, even from the present crisis and trial in your life right now. I will request you to submit it to the test and power of the WORD of God. These WORDS have given solace and encouragement to countless men and women of all ages and situations. Listen to what the WORD of God says, "Blessed are they who treasure his WORD and seek him with all their heart. They do no wrong; they walk in his ways." (Psalm 119: 2-3). It continues in the same psalm to state, "your WORD is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." (Psalm 119: 105).

All Saints Catholic School—Roof Update

All Saints Catholic School, formerly known as Holy Family Catholic School, located at 1926 Marquette Street in Davenport, Iowa, was built in 1964. Many of you may have attended this school growing up and have many fond memories. Some of you had your own children or grandchildren attend as you wanted them to receive an education built around their Catholic faith. All Saints is known for its wonderful, dedicated staff and ability to deliver a quality education while based on our Catholic faith in a diverse student environment.

Like any building, repairs and upkeep are required. Holy Family Parish has maintained the 60 year old building as needed. Over the last 5 years we have replaced two sections of the roof. The first portion cost \$74,000. We received generous donations from two parishes. The second portion of the roof cost \$94,000 and was paid completely by Holy Family.

We are now in need of completing the third and final portion of the roof at a cost of over \$350,000. We are hoping that those who are able, might consider a financial donation to this project. We understand many are not able to do so, but we hope everyone will pray for the staff and students of All Saints Catholic School and the success of this project.
