

April 28, 2024 5th Sunday of Easter

My friend and fellow pastor, Father Paul, noticed unsightly, overgrown trees near his parish church. He asked the maintenance crew to cut back the growth, which they happily did, telling him the trees would be much healthier and even fuller after a good pruning. A few days later, Father Paul received a letter from an irate man in the neighborhood who wrote, "Jesus would <u>never</u> prune trees like that. He loves trees, unlike you."

I suspect that the neighbor was not familiar with this week's Gospel in which Jesus says of his Father, "He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit" (John 15:2) I don't mean to pick too much on that fellow. He was perhaps ignorant of arboriculture. But I'd wager his main confusion was the pruning and removing quality of God's love. That confusion afflicts us all to some degree, doesn't it? It is just so darn easy to react negatively when God cuts something out of our lives and assume it's not his work at all. In the moment, all we see is the loss, and not the loving desire for future flourishing. The cross is the great pruning of Christ's body. Jesus' rising is the brand-new growth. It is God's promise to us that all the painful pruning in life is leading us somewhere beautiful. What has been cut back or out in your life? A friend, an opportunity, a sense of certainty, a job, health, a relationship? This week, offer those dry branches to the one who lovingly prunes us in order to make our lives burst with verdant growth.

From Father Nicholas' desk... **Truth and Mercy**

As I concluded the last edition of Truth and Mercy series it occurred to me that the Word of God eventually creates a VISION for life and a template for living one's life once we pay attention to it. It looks like going to a school and acquiring a skill set to solve life's problems or challenges. So the saying goes that "the school actually passed through us" when we can actualize what we studied there. It is also the case that studying the WORD of God eventually leads to LIVING the Word or one becomes a hypocrite. This is the reason the disciples were first referred to as CHRISTIANS in Antioch because people could identify their way of life with that of Christ (Acts 11: 26).

Sometimes it is so difficult to live in conformity with the ways of the WORD of God. Sometimes I fail to synchronize my lifestyle with the demands of God in his Word. At times it is so challenging to carry out what the Word requires of me. Sometimes I out rightly choose to deviate from its precepts. This leads me at times to feel a sense of unworthiness or not worthy of the name Christian. To a large extent, I fail to keep the covenant God has with me in ignoring Him and His paths. But every time this happens, I feel a sense of not being happy. I feel alone in the wilderness of my own thoughts and isolation. I find myself in a kingdom of the self, where me, myself and I dictates what is done. This is the time I have technically knocked off any other authority over my life but myself. This is the ultimate feeling of "No one tells me what to do." This is really "hell" formed by me to take away my own life. This is not a pretty spot to be at all. This selfimposed kingdom actually promised the opposite of what it can deliver. It does not take too long to see the form of anarchy and confusion in the society to see many people living this sort of life. They are the ultimate "architect" of their lives. But a life run this way ultimately leads to self-destruction. A life based on subjective principles will ultimately be self-destructive.

Will that be the reason for hopelessness, or despair in the world? Will that account in part for unhappiness in homes, schools, institutions, and on the street? The Good NEWS is this!! We are loved and we can only find out in the WORD of God our Father. The TRUE breaking news is that Our Father wishes to have a relationship with us. The way of doing this and achieving this is that we become aware of his living WORD in the scripture. His WORD is a living fountain to drink from. His WORD is TRUTH and MERCY as well. The TRUTH is that He wants a relationship, He craves for a living and flourishing relationship with you. His WORD says, "I stand at the door of your heart and knock, anyone hears my voice and opens the door to me I will come and eat with him/her and they with me." (Revelations 3: 20). Can you imagine your God coming to eat with you? This is what happens at every holy Mass. God leaves his throne in Heaven and decides to settle on the throne of our hearts when we receive Him in the sacrament of his body and blood, soul and divinity. This same God who made himself visible to his disciples at the breaking of the bread. (Luke 24: 35).

When I find the times tough to bear or wondering with a challenging subject, I usually go to the Lord in the sacrament of love on the altars. I seek HIM and spend time with HIM. I truly find new meaning in what the Lord said to his apostles, "Without me you can do nothing." (John 15: 5). At no time has He left me without inspiration, encouragement, illumination or enlightenment. I have received refreshment and new unction whenever I visit with HIM. The WORD made FLESH is always with us 24/7 in the tabernacle and on our altars. Please seek Him who is more ready to help and save than you can ever know.


