

Sixth Sunday of Easter

Once a man came to the Vatican and asked to see Pope John Paul II, claiming that they had been friends in Poland. When told of the man, the Pope said, "He is mistaken about our friendship. I don't recall ever having suffered with him." As it turned out, the man had never known the Pope. Now, I'm not sure if the story is totally factual. But doesn't the juxtaposition of *suffering* with *friendship* sound exactly like JPII? He understood that the deepest and most lasting friendships are forged in the fires of shared suffering. No suffering, no friendship. Amazing. This week we hear Jesus say to the apostles and to us, "You are my friends if you do what I command you" (John 15:14). In Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, God entered the world of human suffering and transformed it into an avenue of friendship with Himself. Following His command — to love, to lay down our lives for others — will always entail suffering. But this suffering only deepens our friendship with Him. His suffering is ours; ours is His. We have become friends of God.

This week, how might you share your suffering with the Risen Jesus? How might he be sharing his suffering with you, in the lives of those around you? Be attentive to that, and you'll find that you are indeed a friend of God, because you've suffered together a great deal — *Father John Muir* ©LPi

From Father Nicholas' desk... Truth and Mercy

"The Lord has sworn an oath and he will not take back his word: "You are a priest forever in the order of Melchizedek." (Psalm 110: 4).

These solemn words were sung at my priestly ordination almost 24 years ago. This was a day the Lord Himself set aside for a young man from Ogbom (akin to Nazareth). A place unseen even in google map, because of its insignificance. Out of this lowly community the Lord assigned me the ministry of bringing His eternal WORD to God's people. It is not only uplifting but at the same time I experience His MERCY through my own incapacity, miserableness to share in the eternal and holy priesthood when I can boast only of my weaknesses which stare me in the face every time.

Looking at the life of David for whom the Lord swore the oath in Psalm 110, he brings me consolation because he was beset with weaknesses too. He was an adulterer and even killed. It looked the same for Moses, who had killed an Egyptian and whose temperament was on high. I can see a pattern in God's choices. The WORD of God attests to this, "But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chooses the weak things of the world to shame the strong." (1 Corinthians: 27). I have looked at the selection of the Apostles and all they grappled with in their individual lives and came to the conclusion that God wants each person called to glory in the power of Mercy in our lives rather than consider that these outstanding graces have come through us.

This is the reason God assigned my ordination to a special month: May. The month dedicated to the Blessed Mother. She is the MOTHER of MERCY and MISTRESS of His TREASURES. She has been my intercessor even when I did not know it. It was also the year of JUBILEE when all sins are forgiven, without which I could not have been considered for ordination. I can say with David over and over again, "My sins are always before me. Against you have I sinned. What is evil in your sight I have done." (Psalm 51: 3-5). St. Pope John Paul II called for this jubilee year in 2000 under the theme, "Incarnationis Mysterium" (Mystery of the Incarnation). The mystery of the Incarnation was wrought through the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary and I had the gracious privilege of being ordained in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, after being baptized on the Birthday of OUR SAVIOR JESUS CHRIST. My priesthood is to birth the WORD in the lives of everyone wherever the Lord takes me.

I was ordained on the First Saturday in the month of May, the 6th of May. Mary has her hands all over me. God had brought me to life on Her first apparition or should we say her bilocation since she was still living in Jerusalem at that time in AD40. I was born on the feast of Our Lady of the Pillar, October 12. May 6th is the Feast of Our Lady Mediatrix of all Graces. Yes indeed, I will not survive without that title since I have been weak from my mother's womb. My life and priesthood is of MERCY and GRACE, nothing else.

I request you in all the charity you can muster to pray THREE HAIL Mary's in thanksgiving to God for calling me. His SACRED PRIESTHOOD despite my acute unworthiness. Let the Lord lead the MISSION He has in store for me. May our Lady, the GENERALISIMO continue to shield me for the GLORY of God and his DIVINE PURPOSE!! Amen.
