

## May 12, 2024

#### 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter

A few months ago, I had the singular privilege of a private meeting with Pope Francis. We were a small group of pastors, composed largely of non-Catholics. The Holy Father wished to discuss our work for Christian unity. The phrase I remember him saying with greatest frequency was: *Tutti dentro*. It means, "Everyone in." He clearly wanted us to emphasize that the Church is made for the whole human race, not a select few. At the center of his concern was unity. We are all brothers and sisters, he said multiple times. The Church's primary longing is for everyone to join Her.

This longing is at the heart of this Ascension feast day. We hear the longest recorded prayer of the one whom Pope Francis represents. Jesus' concern is unity, praying to the Father, "that they may be one, even as we are one" (John 17:11). The deep unity of all people in Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit is what Jesus most desires. It is what he ascends to accomplish.

Do we have this same burning desire in our hearts, too? Or do we see Christian unity as an unrealizable dream? Or worse, as something that threatens our own narrow tribal interests? This feast is a wonderful time to consider our attitude toward Christian unity, and to commit to do whatever we can to foster it. It is the Pope's desire because it is that of Jesus — and it should be ours, too.

#### From Father Nicholas' desk... Truth and Mercy

"This is the will of the Father, that whoever sees the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day." (John 6:40).

This scripture passage is very apt now that we are in the season of first communion. We can see how our children are so well dressed by parents and prepared by catechists, parents, and religious education directors as well as by priests. They have received instructions on the importance of the Body and Blood of Christ in their faith journey. When Christ the Lord was first born into the world, he was received by shepherds and definitely by Mary and Joseph. The angels of God also were on hand to receive their LORD and God, whom they sang to immediately when he was born, "Glory to God in the highest." (Luke 2:14). They saw the child wrapped in swaddling clothes, and lying in a manger they saw their God in that utter simplicity. (Luke 2:12). God in his wisdom chose to be hidden in obscurity of a little infant so that only those who are lowly and humble can find him and worship him.

Going back to the Gospel of John just quoted above, Jesus was reiterating to his followers; disciples as well as apostles what salvation entails. The will of the Father is that everyone or anyone who "SEES" the SON and "BELIEVES" in him shall have eternal life. What kind of seeing does this entail? What kind of sight is expected of us as followers of the Lord in our time? If we follow the example of the shepherds and the holy angels above, they saw with the eyes of faith and did God homage. This is the kind of faith the magi at the birth of Jesus had and they did him homage. This is how the scripture records it. "They went into the house and when they saw the child with Mary his mother, they knelt down and worshipped him." (Matthew 2:11). The magi were astrologers and scientists but "SEEING" with the eyes of faith, they knew, this was the SON of God. They Worshipped him and offered him gifts and treasures appropriate to his status and mission.

The infant wrapped in swaddling clothes is the SON of God! The baby in the manger is the infant King Son of God sent to bring us eternal life. The word of God made flesh in the womb of the Virgin Mary is the WORD crucified on the wood of the cross. This is the same person whom the centurion recognized after his crucifixion when he said, "Indeed he is the SON of God." This is the Christ our children receive as they come for their first communion. Jesus will become a part their lives forever bringing them the mercy, healing and protection every moment of their lives. St. Paul has great encouragement for all of us when he said, "for we live by FAITH and not by sight." Our Lord Jesus Christ is hidden in the bread and wine consecrated on the altar by our priests. He is the ONE recognized by the angels and shepherds and also by the magi. Do you recognize HIM in the SACRED HOST as well? How do you prepare yourself to receive him? Do you show him respect, reverence or disrespect?

The will of the Father is that we see and believe, so that we might have eternal life. Anywhere Jesus went in scripture, he always asked if people believe he could perform a miracle before he goes ahead. If there was no belief then no miracles were possible. In Capernaum Jesus said there were no miracles because they did not believe. Do you Believe in the REAL PRESENCE of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament? Do you believe the same Jesus who performed so many miracles is also present in the SACRED HOST in the hands of the priest? Then there must be a change in how to receive him and what to do when he is in my heart and body. Do I offer him thanks and gratitude for coming to my heart and body? Do I offer him my love and adoration, reverence like the magi in the scripture?


