

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Recently I watched a bunch of YouTube videos on how to optimize willpower in the face of weakness. The message was: do not accept your weakness. Crush it. Dominate it. In one video, however, at the end of a rant by a willpower coach, the muscular stoic admitted, "You'll never actually get what you want, no matter how hard you try." Amazingly, he admitted that willpower alone is not sufficient for us weak-willed humans.

What does God want us to do with our weaknesses, if crushing them with willpower won't work? For example, what should I do with my tendency to arrogance and self-isolation? Or my procrastination? Or my intellectual and physical limitations? Or my selfishness?

The counter-intuitive answer is clear in this week's words from St Paul, "I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses in order that the power of Christ may dwell in me (2 Cor. 12:9)." Boast of our weaknesses? Paul isn't promoting weak-mindedness or laziness. Rather, he perceives that Jesus loves us not despite our weaknesses but because of them. Boasting of our weakness means claiming human will is not all we have. It means turning to God whenever we feel weak, which—let's face it—is almost all the time. When we do, we learn to love our weaknesses, because it's there that we meet the strength of Christ. This week, I challenge us to find ways to boast not in willpower but in weakness.

From Father Nicholas' desk... Truth and Mercy

Truth and Mercy series

I have heard an opinion which seems to suggest that the St. Michael, the archangel prayer said after the Holy Mass is not required or that the reason for saying the prayer in the late 19th century is no longer valid, for the church is not battling the struggle with our temporal goods. On the first account, the prayers as it stands can be prayed after the celebration of the Holy Mass, if anyone does not feel like praying it they are more than free not to. However, on the second note, there has never been a shred of truth that connects the composing of this beautiful and important prayer to the struggle with temporal goods of the church, rather the struggle for the spiritual goods: SOULS.

Pope St. Leo XIII on October 13, 1884, exactly 33 years before the Miracle of the Sun received a chilling vision that left a clear mark on his pontificate. He was gifted with a peep into the future and the storms that would be caused by Satan. Satan was to be allowed a hundred year reign to unleash terror. Pope St. Leo rushed into his office and composed this prayer to St. Michael the archangel. Though no longer obligatory to say it does not mean the reason for composing this prayer has vanished or that the evil of Satan in the world has diminished. I will err on the path of praying it because I can feel its efficacy every time.

The mission of Michael in scripture is very clear. He and St. Gabriel are the ambassadors of the incarnation and redemption. It is very instructive from the Book of Revelation chapter 12 that he fought to ensure the birth of Jesus Christ. The dragon desired to destroy the child and the mother Mary. Michael is appointed to the rescue. He aborts the mission of the dragon, or else where would we be without Mary and the baby Jesus? The dragon was intent on "stealing and aborting" God's plan for our salvation. Satan is interested in every mission that Mary and the infant Jesus is involved in. The dragon wishes to thwart every attempt at the freedom of the children of God from all forms of darkness, disease and sin. He does this by unleashing a reign of ignorance or doubt in the mind of God's people. He sows discord and conflict, amongst the mystical body of Christ. The dragon is interested in making us lose focus in this valley of tears. He is heavily invested in ensuring the captivity and bondage for so many souls either spiritually, mentally, emotionally, psychologically or otherwise.

Michael is the antidote. Michael means "who is like unto God". He stands tall crushing the infernal beast when we call on him. Please get yourself ready for the spiritual battle next month from the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on August 15. We plan to pray this powerful chaplet until the Solemnity of the Archangels on September 29. Please begin by preparing a list of those whom you would like prayers to be offered for. This 40 day novena is for everyone in our parish family. We intend to offer special prayers for all our school kids as well. They are often more challenged than we imagine in this culture today.

Do not forget we are on the 54 day Holy Rosary novena as well. We are virtually on the 2nd week mark. You can hop in anytime. The termination date is August 8, the feast day of St. Dominic, who received the holy rosary from Our Lady in the year 1214. That's already 810 years ago.
