

From Father Nicholas' desk... Truth and Mercy Series XXXI

How do you begin your day friends? This has been a question which plagues my mind a few times. It looks like the way I begin my day influences the outcome or what I get from it at the end of the day. It does seem this is beyond waking up from the wrong side of one's bed. It appears that the choices I make getting out of bed has an effect on my day being blessed, joyful, or not full.

Now let me share with you how I begin my day. I remember this will sound weird because one day I was visiting all my kids at All Saints Catholic School and a kid asked me how many times I pray in a day. It was one very important and interesting question anyone had ever asked me. On top of my head I could not just say how many times but I started by remembering how many prayers I do and at what time. In answering this question even as I write, I think of a story about going to the brook to fetch water. In many African rural communities people have to go far distances to fetch water for household use. This is as far sometimes as 3-4 miles and back. The earlier you go the better you can find the brook/stream still and fresh. The later in the day you go to fetch, the more it has become stirred and unclean so you allow it a few hours or add purification before drinking or cooking with it. The earlier risers get clean water while the later guys get not so clean water. That could mean waking up as early as 5am.

I begin my day sometimes at 5am. As soon as I am aware that I am awake, I hit the floor on my knees to pray and be thankful for God giving me new life and restoring me from the darkness of sleep. I thank him for the new day dawning. I thank him for my family and friends, for my parishioners whom I have the greatest privilege serving as their priest. These moments are the most precious to me. I then entrust my entire day into the hands of the Blessed Mother by singing her favorite hymn "Ave Maris Stella". I surrender every schedule and person God has put on my path that day into Her hands. It is only Mary, the beloved Mother of Jesus and our mother, that can lead us to Jesus. She alone can make our offering truly acceptable to Him. This prayer session could take me between 15-30 minutes.

After this I make for the bathroom getting ready for my hour of adoration which usually begins at 6:00am with the "Angelus". I adore the Lord "By Mary, With Mary, In Mary, Through Mary and For Mary"! She alone can make the best form of adoration to the Father because She is His beloved daughter, the beloved Mother of the Son and the Spouse of the Holy Spirit. I do not have to "do" or "make" up a prayer list. She is the medium through which my oblation and sacrifice goes to the Blessed Trinity. Just as at the wedding feast in Cana of Galilee, the Lord Jesus is pleased by Her request. Her prayers to the Blessed Trinity are always answered by God. Hence she is "Sovereign by Grace". If She is "Mediatrix of all graces", we should go to Her in all our necessities, all our indebtedness and inadequacies. I go to Her in all my many NEEDS including those of YOURS as well. Your SOUL has been entrusted to my care and I feel the RESPONSIBILITY to honor that SACRED TRUST of God.

Do you also feel the need to go to the "stream of living water", Jesus Christ, like I do early in the morning? In the stillness of the morning, Jesus listens and knows you consider HIM an important and integral part of your day!! You don't have to start "big" like me. But START you must. Begin in the most little way you are being called right now. You can start as little as 5-10 minutes in the morning. Once you taste and see what the Lord can do, you will naturally increase it. Amen.
