

From Father Nicholas' desk... Truth and Mercy Series (XXXXIV)

A few years ago, I received a call and invitation to bless a home around here. This lady obviously goes to the 7th Day Adventist church but was having some issues in the house she lived in with her family. When I went to see them, she narrated to me how they were being harassed at night by a "ghost". It was a graphic illustration of how at night this ghost disturbs their sleep and comfort. It usually happens in the dead of the night between 2 and 3am. Once this occurs, she and her family find it difficult to go to bed. The question I asked myself was why call a Catholic priest and not the pastor of their denomination. But this did not dissuade me from carrying out a clearly priestly function. I was cognizant of their faith which led them to me.

I exorcised water and salt as the ritual of blessings stipulates. I proceeded to bless the entire home in praise and invocation of the Holy Name of God. Only in this "name shall every knee bow, in Heaven and on earth and under the earth and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2: 10-11). After this blessing, I told them they would not see anything like this ghost in their home anymore. Since that time, it has ceased. Not because it is me but because of the rite of blessing handed over to us by the Church of God. Sometime in the summer this year I was also invited to bless the Women's Choice and pregnancy center in Bettendorf. I used a large quantity of water and salt and the entire premises was almost "flooded" with Holy water. It was filled with singing and praising to God. We invoked the "Lord to arise and let his enemies be scattered" as in Psalm 68. This is because one of the psalms the devil hated most is psalm 68. Sometime during the 40 day novena to St. Michael and the nine choirs of angel, I was also invited to bless "King's Harvest". This is an important place in our community that caters for homeless friends, our brothers and sisters. We spent quite a while with some of the residents and volunteers walking and singing praises while pouring exorcised water and salt all over the building and rooms. We were setting the place apart only for God's use. We were sending away anything that is contrary to the name of God. Every evil spirit was being cast out.

Have you considered blessing your home? Do you think there is a need for it? Why do we need to bless our homes or cars or things we use? The scripture tells us, "Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain. Unless the Lord watches over the city, the watchman stays awake in vain." (Psalm 127: 1). Blessing your home brings the grace and effect of God there. God is invited to have dominion over your home so He can watch over all those who dwell there and all your prayers can rise like incense to the throne of God. The house blessing is an invitation of God's care, protection and power over those who dwell in such blessed home. This is important especially when moving in or during the open house or at difficult times one might invite a priest to bless their home. Once we bless our home, it becomes a house of prayer as well. God's spirit dwells undeniably there with us. We are very confident that there is no foe watching or disrupting our lives. Sometimes when we notice some unnecessary movements, or lights going off and on (flickers), or picture frames especially of the Saints or Jesus, Mary and Joseph just fall off without reason, it might be a time to invite your priest to bless your home.

Guess whose home we are blessing on the 9th of December? The Rectory of our dear parish is going to be blessed by Bishop Dennis G. Walsh. After many months of work to set up a place for priests who will serve Holy Family parish now and, in the future, it is now time to make it a Holy Place to live. You are welcome after the Holy Mass of the Immaculate Conception at 6pm for the blessing and fellowship afterwards.




