

From Father Nicholas' desk... Truth and Mercy Series (II)

Truth and Mercy series January 12, 2025

At the beginning of the year 2025, I am full of joy and anticipation for all the numerous graces and blessings this year holds for me and you all as a parish community. As individuals, corporate organizations map out strategies for the new year, it is important to set our priorities right. Our choices go a long way to fashion where we will be at the end of the year or what will be our portion of blessing received. Like everything in the world choices are so important.

As a parish community, we are gearing up to participate fully as much as possible in the Jubilee of Hope as called by our Holy Father. We are having conversations on paying a parish visit to nursing homes, praying with them. It will be an opportunity to offer them gifts and the sacrament of the anointing of the sick. We are currently considering Good Samaritan's and Vista. This kind of mission is an example of means of obtaining a plenary indulgence. We hope our visit can bring HOPE to our brothers and sisters, especially those who do not usually get visits.

This year as well, we are considering having what is tagged "Resurrected Treasures" sales. We plan to have parish members bring stuff from their homes for sale for missions to the poor and other priority areas to be decided as we go along. There is some buzz already created in this regard both within and outside our parish. Please check our bulletin for possible dates and how you might be willing to avail yourself of this wonderful event. If you have ideas on how this can be successful, please do not hesitate to volunteer this information to our parish office.

Another way of receiving a plenary indulgence is participating in a parish or diocesan program of teaching the faith. As a parish, we are discussing on launching a platform on a monthly basis, teaching various aspects of the faith to our parishioners and the Catholic community around us. This we are tagging: "Know your Faith". We are still in the infancy stages of the plans, so your prayers and suggestions are welcome.

This February, we shall begin celebrating the Holy Mass on Fridays in the parish with the blessing of the presence of Fr. William Kneemiller in our community. This Mass will be at 12:05 on Fridays except the first Friday of the month.

On a final note, this year, let us seek an area of growth in our spiritual life. This could be spending 10 minutes in private prayers, studying the Bible for 15 minutes, participating in one more Holy Mass during the week, offering up some prayers for holy souls in purgatory, you might consider visiting a nursing home or your old colleagues, family members in the nursing home, joining the Knights of Columbus or the Legionary as a means of being more active in your faith life. It could also be volunteering to be a lector, extraordinary minister of the Eucharist, an altar server or an usher in the parish. We also need help as animators of the newly formed Holy Childhood Association, or help us with your skill in livestreams of our parish prayer or liturgy.


