

From Father Nicholas' desk... Truth and Mercy Series (V)

"Behold this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted, and you a sword shall pierce, so that the thoughts of many hearts might be revealed."

It is unbelievable that it is 40 days since Christmas day when Simeon, priest and prophet made these powerful and prophetic words at the Presentation of Jesus in the temple. That very day, there were many kids presented as the Jewish customs prescribed. It was, however, stated that Simeon was able to identify the Messiah born in flesh. This was because he had a prior revelation that he would not see death until he has set his eyes on the Messiah. In the space of these 40 days likewise, the infant Jesus has moved from home to home in our parish visiting and bringing along with him blessings and favors to those who invited him into their home. It is practically impossible for Jesus to visit without leaving an indelible print of favors and graces. Those who had him will have stories to tell. Those who made a home for him or made time for him, those who provided a place in their "INN" definitely will receive the promise of the Savior. In the old rite, people usually bring down their Christmas tree at this moment because it formally marks the end of the Christmas season.

This weekend February 1 and; 2, the parish plays host to all our religious, those consecrated to the Lord via the medium of the evangelical counsels of Obedience, Chastity and poverty. This form of life has become a "road less travelled" in our society. It has become truly a life of contradiction where people wonder what is the significance or meaning of such life in our modern society. The religious are the spouses of Jesus and if he is a sign of contradiction, so his spouses would be. If nuns or religious are not seen, the light of Christ whom they represent will not be seen. The religious in our church witness to a heavenly realm and a heavenly city "where people are not given in marriage." They help us visualize the heavenly city where our major preoccupation will be praising God and enjoying his beatific vision. Our religious sisters are the sign of the age to come. They give everything to live for Christ. I encourage us to pray for our religious nuns and also to join us for a reception in their honor. Please do not pass by them without a word of encouragement.

In March we shall be playing host to "A Holy Face Devotion Mission". We shall play host to Fr. Lawrence Carnie, a great author, who had written so much about the Holy Face Devotion. Please mark your calendars as more information comes your way. In the same breath, we plan to visit the Good Samaritan's/Heritage Court for Easter. We shall be visiting the "Vista" home too. Through this we hope to obtain plenary indulgencies. I will speak a little more about this soon. These visits are being planned for April 22 and 23, 2025.


