

From Father Nicholas' desk... Truth and Mercy Series (Holy Week)

"Our one desire is that every one of you should go on showing the same earnestness to the end, to the perfect fulfillment of our hopes, never growing careless, but imitating those who have the faith and the perseverance to inherit the promises." (Hebrew 6:11)

During my office of the reading today this text spoke out to me and I am sharing this with you my beloved parishioners as we enter into Holy Week of 2025, in the Jubilee of Hope. The Holy Week is so called because the greatest mysteries of our faith were enacted, and manifest for the very first time. This week is called Holy because the holiest events in human history took place therein. It is also called Holy week because the entire desire of all the ages came to fulfillment during this week.

During this week the connection between Christmas becomes so clear. The Infant King who came to save is mounting His throne: CROSS to free us from the captivity of sin. The love of God the Father is made manifest in His Son who was "given for the life of the world." Those Words are not empty because they come alive in the paschal mystery: His Passion, Death and Resurrection. This tree is not the tree of death like that which led Adam and Eve to sin but the tree of life, restoration and freedom. Rather than the serpent which deceived the people of God, we have the Lord of life who brings life from the wood of the cross.

This week calls for true earnestness to follow and participate in the liturgy. The peak of which comes from Holy Thursday until Easter Sunday. On Holy Thursday, Our Lord of life offers a new and eternal covenant in His Blood for the forgiveness of sin. You will recall the words of the Archangel Gabriel at the announcement, "his name will be Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." (Matthew 1: 21). On this day, He also instituted the priesthood, His continuous institution to continue the celebration of this sacrifice for all ages. A new priesthood, without ancestry, called by God like Aaron was. A dignity not accorded to angels.

Good Friday is truly a special day! The wood of the CROSS is unveiled for us to kiss and acknowledge the saving work Our Lord did and continues to do for us. Without the Cross, there is no hope for fallen humanity. The cross has not ceased to save even after 2000 years. The celebration of the Sacred Passion on Good Friday is a clear testimony to the Lord's presence with us illuminating our world through His victory over death and its many manifestations.

I invite you earnestly to join as a community to celebrate the height of the mysteries of our Faith. This will inspire our hope in the Lord who never tires of freeing us from all principalities and powers. Let us devote time to prayer and silence. This usually helps to relive the experience and also open us to graces to understand and show gratitude to the Lord of all of History. Amen.

To receive the Divine Mercy graces, simply receive Holy Communion in a state of Grace on Divine Mercy Sunday, and perform acts of Mercy, such as attending Mercy Sunday and venerating His Image.

A plenary indulgence is available for those who attend the Divine Mercy Sunday Celebration and fulfill the usual conditions for a plenary indulgence. Sacred Heart has also been designated as a pilgrimage site for the Jubilee this year, so an additional plenary indulgence is available.

TO ALL SCOTT COUNTY K-12 CATHOLIC SCHOOL PARENTS (Newly enrolled & returning) ESA PROGRAM GOES UNIVERSAL!

Beginning this fall, Iowa's Students First Act allows all Iowa families to access ESA(s) for their K-12 student(s) attending accredited nonpublic schools - regardless of income.

An ESA is a public fund deposited into a government authorized account that can be used for tuition and other qualified educational expenses. All lowa families should apply. <u>Even if you</u> received an ESA in the past, you need to reapply each and every year!

Important 2025-26 Dates & Deadlines

April 16, 2025 – ESA Applications Open. Parents/Guardians can begin applying for an ESA at 8:00 AM. We encourage families to apply early.

<u>June 30, 2025</u> – ESA Applications Close. LATE APPLICATIONS ARE NOT ACCEPTED. Late July – September 30, 2025 – Parents must log in to their Odyssey account and approve fall tuition as submitted by their child's school. If this is not done by September 30th, your student will forfeit their ESA for the entire school year.

<u>Mid-December thru January 31, 2026</u> – Parents must return to their Odyssey account to approve spring tuition. This is required to retain the approved ESA for 2nd semester.

Family Tuition Plan: If your tuition is above the ESA amount you may be able to qualify for additional tuition assistance through the **Family Tuition Plan.** This state subsidized program is limited to lowa families with total income of less than 400% of poverty.
