

PASTORAL COLUMN

Scriptures: Is 6:1-2a, 10-11; 1 Thess 5:16-24; John 1:6-8,19-28

In today's first reading, Isaiah writes about the one to come who has the spirit of the Lord God upon him, the one who was sent to bring glad tidings to the poor, to heal the brokenhearted, proclaim liberty to captives and release to prisoners. Isaiah says many more things about this special person. Unlike most Catholics today who aren't very familiar with the Scriptures, the Hebrew people of Jesus' day were very familiar with Isaiah's prophecies.

When Jesus began doing the things that Isaiah wrote about, people began to wonder...could this be *him*? Just like in modern days, some of the people in Jesus' day believed sooner than others and some never did. More people came to believe after Jesus rose from the dead.

As Christians, we are called to follow Christ and to emulate his actions and care for others. This year, as much or more than any other I remember, our world needs glad tidings, healing of hearts and liberty to those feeling oppressed and imprisoned by a variety of situations. So many people have had a really difficult, lonely and disheartening year in the light of Covid-19. Many have broken hearts, having lost loved ones, jobs, or homes. It has been a lonely year for many. Most everyone has had to put a hold on personal visits from loved ones for different periods of time. On top of Covid-19 issues, political conflict have created rifts in family and friendship groups.

Each year I am deeply touched by the generosity of our people, throughout the entire year, but especially during the Advent and Christmas seasons. The needs seem so much greater this year, but you have certainly stepped up to meet those needs. The sheer number of donations for all of the drives we hold in our cluster during this time has been incredible.

No doubt many, many folks who are hurting will feel glad tidings, experience healing in their hearts and feel free from at least some of the issues that oppress them and imprison them. Thank you for the many ways you emulate the one who has the spirit of the Lord God upon him.

May the remainder of your Advent season be blessed with quiet anticipation of, and preparation for, the coming of our Savior anew into our world that is so much in need of salvation.


Please remember to use the **hand sanitizer** provided before receiving Communion. It will help keep everyone safe, including our Eucharistic ministers.

I know that at DSCS our students, staff and families have been busy working our way through our Advent calendar. We have made cards for the homebound, made decorations for the nursing home, prayed a Hail Mary on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception and so much more! We are also busy preparing for our Christmas Concerts. The journey continues!

Over the next several weeks I would like to highlight how learning happens in each of our fabulous classrooms. I think you will be surprised at how innovative, faith-filled and creative our DSCS staff is. Staff members will also highlight some needs for their classrooms in preparation for our **“Sponsor a Classroom Initiative”** coming in January. Perhaps you will be willing to help make their dreams come true!

Featured Classroom: DSCS Spanish, Art & CAD

You may be surprised to learn that at DSCS we teach Spanish to grades 3K-8th. Our students have ample opportunities to internalize meanings of words before they produce them. In other words, they have many opportunities to match what they hear and read in the current language. We use visuals, listening and physical experiences. It doesn't matter the age of our students. Students are more engaged in their learning when we use all of their senses. Our youngest students enjoy bilingual story time. This is always a very interactive time with counting, asking questions, and repeating. My wish is to have more bilingual books to read to them. Another activity that the little ones like is to dance and sing. It would be great to have more Bilingual or Spanish CDs or DVDs.

Students from 3rd grade to 8th grade have a favorite activity that uses technology. We use Kahoot often. I have created twenty-two assignments during the past two years. These include: vocabulary, culture, and community. I also use Kahoot in my CD and Art classes. This game has been free; however, because it has been so demanded in the educational area, they will be charging subscriptions. My wish is to be able to afford a yearly subscription so that I am able to continue using it. I plan to use our classroom wish list money to make this happen!

LISTEN WITH AN OPEN HEART

...Listen with an open heart; Hear God's voice and follow...

Looking for love? God always has your back – looking after you. He knows you – God is always revealing himself to us so that we may enter into a deeper relationship with him. Remember, God started this relationship. He created each of us – we have to be quiet and listen and respond to God's call. God seeks us out. How do I know this? Well, Scripture has many examples – Abram, Moses, Isaiah and Jeremiah. Oh, and Linda too. Linda you say? Here's my first "call" story.

As many of you know, I love to sing, but especially at Mass. I remember as a little girl looking forward to going to Mass with my parents and three younger siblings. If we were late in arriving, as is often the case with a family of six with four under the age of 5, then the ushers would ask us to go sit in the choir loft for Mass. As we walked up the stairs to the choir loft, I would look for the stained glass window of St. Cecilia along the stairs. She's the patron saint of music. I recall always feeling like I was "allowed" to experience heaven on earth when I sat in the choir loft and listened to the choir sing harmonious music in praise of God.

With the Sacrament of Confirmation, our gifts, given by God, are strengthened by the Holy Spirit when we're anointed with the holy chrism. In the diocese where I grew up (and in the '60's), we were confirmed in 5th grade. The next year, I began playing the organ at Mass. My friend and I taught ourselves to play guitar and we began playing and singing for our school Masses too. That's over 50 years ago now. And still I find that God calls me out of my inner quiet to praise him in music, especially during the Liturgy. I feel it deep down inside me that I "must" do this. This feeling reminds me of how the prophet Jeremiah felt when he tells God that "*you duped me*" in Jeremiah, 20:7. He goes on though, "*But then it becomes like fire burning in my heart...I grow weary holding it in, I cannot endure it.*" (Jeremiah 20:8-9) I often feel that I am not my "best" self when I can't sing or play music during Mass.

I wonder if sometimes you feel this way too about things that you're passionate about. We are made for so much more. How wonderful for us that we have the Sacraments. Being open to God's call requires a response from us. I hope you hear His call today. I end this short article as I began, with lyrics from the hymn **Turn to the Living God**, "Come, sing with joy to the Lord. Listen with an open heart. Hear God's voice and follow..."
