

## PASTORAL COLUMN

*Scriptures: Sam 7:1-5,8b-12,14a; Rom 16:25-27; Luke 1:26-38*

I often wonder what Mary must have been thinking when the angel Gabriel appeared to her and told her the news that she would be with child and bear a son even though she had no relations with a man. I wonder if, just for a little while, Mary was scared. What would people say? How would she tell Joseph and her parents? How would she explain this? Would they believe her? Would Joseph leave her? Would her parents disown her? It was all possible. It was also possible that this situation could end up costing Mary her very life, because it was legal in Jesus' day for an unmarried woman found to be pregnant to be stoned.

Mary was definitely wise beyond her years, but she was also somewhere between 12-14 years old, Scripture scholars tell us. I can't imagine that a small part of her wasn't scared for at least a little while. And yet, she rises above her worry and faces her fears. The result? God becomes human and saves the human race...all because a young girl was courageous and faithful beyond her years.

There is so much we can learn from Mary that can help us through some of the most worrisome and scary times in our lives. Perhaps you, or someone you love, has discovered an unexpected pregnancy. Perhaps you have lost a job and can't seem to find a new one. It may be that a broken marriage or friendship has left you feeling lonely and unloved. Perhaps low self-esteem makes you feel as if you are of little or no worth. Maybe an addiction has trapped you in a life you no longer recognize. Perhaps mental illness or depression lays you flat for days on end. Maybe financial problems cause constant worry about how you will pay your bills, support your family, or save for the future. Perhaps grief over the death of a loved one causes you to isolate yourself because you don't think anyone else understands.

When these (and other) difficult situations freeze us with fear, we can look and pray to Mary for the courage and wisdom to face that fear and work through the struggle. If we can do that with a deep sense of faith, then we will no doubt recognize God in the midst of the trials just as surely as we do in the celebrations of life.

A blessed final week of Advent, and a most holy Christmas season to you and all you love.





## THE CURIOUS CATHOLIC

### *Q. What exactly are the 12 days of Christmas?*

Where do you fall on the Christmas tree spectrum? Do you take your tree down before Santa’s sleigh makes it back to the North Pole, or do you leave on the red lights, throw a few hearts on the bare branches and wish your sweetie a Happy Valentine’s Day? Do you still get sap on your hands when removing the ornaments or does your vacuum cleaner have more pine needles than the tree itself? The rule of thumb our family goes by is to leave it up at least until the Epiphany which is traditionally considered the 12<sup>th</sup> Day of Christmas.

Some people may not realize that the 12 days of Christmas isn’t just a long-winded song where your memory is put to the test. Let’s see, is it 8 maids-a-milking or 9? What is there 11 of? After the 5 gold rings, I always lose count. But the one thing I do remember is that Christmas doesn’t end on December 26, it’s barely getting started. The 12 days of Christmas begin on Christmas Eve and goes until the feast of the Magi, when the three wise men brought their gifts to the Holy Family. During the 12 days, we also celebrate (on January 1) the Feast of the Solemnity of Mary. Without her “yes”, we wouldn’t even have this season. There is also the feast of the Baptism of Jesus which falls the weekend after the Epiphany.

I find it funny that we start hearing Christmas music while we are heating up Thanksgiving leftovers, but when the Christmas season truly starts, the radio stations are back to business as usual. But maybe that isn’t such a bad thing. The commercial holiday season has already moved on to Valentine’s Day, which means we can focus on the true meaning of Christmas. And what better symbol of the Christmas season, then to see all those red hearts in the stores. The symbol of love. So, on December 26, don’t stop celebrating yet. The season of Christmas is just beginning and may you keep that peace, love and joy in your hearts all year round.
