PASTORAL COLUMN

Scriptures: Gen. 15:1-6; 21:1-3; Heb 11:8,11-12,17-19; Luke 2:22-40

The Advent and Christmas season usually seems far too busy for most of us to take enough time to really prepare for Christ's coming in our lives. This isn't just true of "ordinary" parishioners, but it is often also true for those who are highly involved volunteering in the Church...and even for those of us who work for the church. We get so caught up in the things we "ought" to do for Christmas...the gifts we "should" buy, the cookies we "ought" to bake, the parties we feel obligated to attend, etc., and we forget what's really important.

When I was in college, a good friend and I made an agreement. We were talking about how "out-of-the-ordinary" God's love for us was. In the course of that conversation, we decided that every year at Christmas time, each of us would set aside a little money to do something out of the ordinary with someone special in our lives. For me, it was a tradition that lasted 25 years. I have a long list of fun events with people I love: plays, concerts, museums, the three domes, the zoo, etc. Several years ago, my attempt to carry on the tradition didn't end well. In fact, it was so emotionally painful to me that I didn't make any attempt to renew the tradition. And, although I kept that tradition alive much longer than my college friend did, I'm sorry that I haven't since made the effort to bring it back to life.

The biggest thing that tradition did for me was to remind me that Christmas is about love. I "know" this, of course. But to "know" something and to *really* KNOW something are two completely different realities. And sometimes, frankly, we all need tangible reminders. Ultimately, Christmas is certainly about the incredible love that God has for each one of us, but it is also about the love of other people in our lives. Most of us don't have the kind of intimate, personal experiences of God that some characters in the Bible had. Most often, we experience God's love manifest in the love of the people in our lives. When we experience the love of another...no matter what form of love that may take (spouse, child, grandchild, sibling, good friend, etc.)...we experience the love of our God because all love ultimately begins with God.

That is one reminder that I have missed since I haven't made an effort to continue my tradition of doing something out of the ordinary with someone I love at Christmas. There is hope that this year that my tradition can be renewed. The Christmas season is not over yet.


