## PASTORAL COLUMN

*Scriptures: 1 Sam. 3:3b-10,19; 1 Cor. 6:13c-15a,17-20; Jn 1:35-42*

In today's first reading, we hear a beautiful story about young Samuel. God calls him three times. The first two times, Samuel does not recognize God's voice and runs to his mentor Eli because he thinks Eli is calling him. Even a wise Eli doesn't immediately recognize God is calling Samuel. The second time, Eli realizes that God is calling and tells Samuel how to respond. The third time God calls, Samuel is ready to respond.

This is a story about listening well. Perhaps in today's world, we can ponder not just how we can listen to God more deeply, but how can we listen to one another with open ears, open minds and open hearts. There is a popular saying that says we have two ears and one mouth for a reason...we should listen twice as much as we speak.

I can't tell you how many times, when in a conversation with someone who disagrees with some of my viewpoints, I remind myself (and often my conversation partner) that every situation is far more complicated than my personal opinion of it. I wish those words would always influence my words and actions, but I must admit that sometimes my opinion too quickly directs what I say and do.

For example, I can't pretend to know what it is like to be married, to be a man, to be a minority, to be homeless, to be a priest, etc. I can have uninformed opinions about what I think it is like to belong to those groups, or I can inform my opinions by good listening practices. I do know people in each of those categories that I love and trust. If I listen to their experiences, I can better understand what they feel and how they experience reality. When I take the time to do that, it can, and usually does, help form my opinions. Whether we are conservative or liberal or in-between, let us commit to listening to one another with an open mind, open heart and a deep respect for other human beings.

## FRATELLI TUTTI ON FRATERNITY AND SOCIAL FRIENDSHIP

Pope Francis *"The world grows and is filled with new beauty, thanks to the successive syntheses produced between cultures that are open and free of any form of cultural imposition... Each particular group becomes part of the fabric of universal communion and there discovers its own beauty."* (§ 148-149)

Civil unrest sparked by racial, cultural, and religious prejudices are unfortunately nothing new. It's a sad reality that doesn't look like it will end any time soon.

In high school, one of the field trips suggested was to attend the Folk Fair in Milwaukee. Being a foodie and naturally curious about other cultures, this was the festival for me. It was awesome to see numerous people coming together to experience the food, art and customs of various cultures.

Each booth added something unique to the festival and elevated the experience of the attendee. It's too bad we couldn't take this curiosity, appreciation and willingness to engage in other cultures from the confines of the fairgrounds to our neighborhoods and families. For some reason the harmony, curiosity and willingness to engage in other cultures that exists at festivals can sometimes turn into apprehensiveness or worse, a complete refusal to welcome the culture into our presence. While this is not the case in every situation, cultures clashing around the world is a common occurrence.

The strange thing is this apprehensiveness is not always present in the business world. For example, an Italian restaurant would much rather see a Chinese restaurant move in across the street as it would offer something new and wouldn't cause as much competition as would another Italian restaurant. Diversity of cultures in the business world increases revenue and visitors to an area, which is generally seen as a good thing.

This duplicity between welcoming culturally diverse businesses and being apprehensive about welcoming different cultures into one's neighborhood is referred to as the "utilitarian approach" by Pope Francis in paragraph 139. The "utilitarian approach" is when a particular culture is valued in so far as it benefits the dominant culture. It is certainly an easy mindset to fall into because this is how life operates in general. We go to work and, in so far as we are contributing positively to our workplace, we receive a paycheck and retain our position. If we fail to benefit our workplace, we may soon find ourselves out of a job, and reasonably so. This same approach cannot be taken with respect to cultural assimilation.

With respect to cultures, Pope Francis says we ought to incorporate a factor of "gratuitousness." (§ 139) "Gratuitousness makes it possible for us to welcome the stranger, even though this brings us no immediate tangible benefit." (§ 139) This is the mindset we ought to cultivate, if we don't already have it, or safeguard and strengthen if we do.
