## PASTORAL COLUMN

## THE ALPHA CONFERENCE

*Scriptures: Jon 3:1-5,10; 1 Cor. 7:29-31; Mk 1:14-20*

In today's Gospel, we hear Mark's account of the calling of the first disciples. Unlike in Luke's Gospel, where Jesus heals Peter's mother-in-law before calling the first disciples, here there is no mention of the two knowing each other. Jesus is walking along the shore of the Sea of Galilee. He first sees Simon and Andrew fishing and calls them to follow him. They do, abandoning their nets, which were their means of making a living.

A short distance down the shoreline, Jesus sees James and John, who are fishing with their father. After Jesus calls them, these two don't only leave their livelihood behind, but also their father. In Jewish culture, that would have been equivalent to denouncing their father.

There is a sense of immediacy that takes place throughout Mark's Gospel. He uses the word "immediate" more than any other evangelist. Here we see that the response of all four of the fishermen is immediate...no questions, no hesitation. They are all in.

Their response makes me wonder about how we respond to Jesus' calls to us. Perhaps the fishermen's nets are a symbol of things that entangle us and prevent us from following Jesus. If you are anything like me, your response is usually not nearly as prompt as that of these four fishermen. No, we have things to do, projects to complete, our own plans for the direction of our lives. Sometimes we don't want to be inconvenienced, uncomfortable or invited to change our way of thinking, acting or being.

Last weekend, I wrote about listening more closely to God's call. This week, I invite all of you to join me in being more immediate in our response when Jesus calls us. Let's follow Jesus with no hesitation, leaving behind any "nets" that might entangle us and prevent us from being fully committed to the mission.

Over the next several weeks, I would like to highlight how learning happens in each of our fabulous classrooms. I think you will be surprised at how innovative, faith-filled and creative our DSCS staff is. Staff members will also highlight some needs for their classrooms in preparation for our *"Sponsor a Classroom Initiative"* this month. Perhaps you will be willing to help make their dreams come true!

#### *Featured Classroom: DSCS 5th-8th Math & Science*

In the 5th -8th grade math and science class, we learn through collaboration and a hands-on approach. In math, we create small groups based on math ability. This allows us to meet every student where they are at. Groups move through the curriculum in a pace that is best for them. Some of our students will even complete freshman algebra in 8th grade because of advancement.

Last year many of our teachers became STEM certified. In our classroom we work on integrating the science, technology, engineering, and mathematical disciplines. This year we are also integrating writing into our classroom by researching space and scientists. We are also focusing on making models. Our models can be made from simple drawings, clay, art supplies, or even created using coding from our Sphero robots. We use whatever material we can find to make learning more hands-on.

The 7th/8th grade class, being the oldest students in the school, also have a few extra duties such as helping with service projects and having enrichment classes. During enrichment classes, students learn how to cook, sew, paint, dance, and create stained glass pictures. One of our enrichment activities we would like to do is create a stained glass mural for the school. To accomplish this, we need donations of stained glass and glass cutters. Another goal for the middle school class is to send them on a spiritual retreat. This is a perfect age for students to fall in love with their faith. #### *Featured Classroom: DSCS Computer Keyboarding Class*

Computer keyboarding is taught to Grades 3rd and 4th. Since students use the keyboard starting in Grade 4th and in all classes after that, we want to help them develop this skill. Most of the first semester in 3rd grade is spent learning keyboarding - without looking - I hope. That is quite a challenge for those young ones, but they are up to that challenge. Second semester, we spend time improving the accuracy and speed through related drills. Students' speed and accuracy progress is checked periodically with two-minute timings. In 4th grade, the first quarter is used to continue improving the students' keyboarding proficiency. In the second quarter, word processing projects are introduced using the Google Docs program. Using teacher-created projects, students work at their own pace, once the project has been introduced with teacher demonstration. After word processing projects, students proceed to do some Google Slide projects - which you and I might know as Power Point. Students create slides including using clip art, animation, and a variety of formatting techniques. As their teacher, it is very rewarding to see their keyboarding skills develop.


