

YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

PASTORAL COLUMN

Scriptures: Dt 18:15-20; 1 Cor. 7:32-35; Mk 1:21-28

As long as I remember, I've heard people in the church complain about people in the church, and about the church itself. Sometimes I'm the person people complain about, and if I'm honest, I have sometimes been the complainer. We human beings have a way of recognizing faults in others much more often than we care to admit our own faults and weaknesses. As much as we strive to follow Christ, our humanness means failure is part of the package. We sometimes fail. We fail God, we fail others, and we fail ourselves.

This is what we are about as Church. We share life and death, laughter and tears, suffering and joy. We celebrate together, cry together, and *fail one another*. We help each other rise about tragedy and sin. *We sometimes hurt one another. We ask for, receive, and offer forgiveness to one another.* As much as we try, we often fall short of the call to be ever more Christ-like. We aren't perfect, and if we are the Church, we can't expect a perfect church.

Our Church isn't perfect, because we are in it! A church made up of imperfect humans can never be perfect. The good news is that, even though we aren't the perfect church, we can move ever closer to that reality. God offers forgiveness when we fail to live up to our call. We are a church that believes in forgiveness, conversion, mercy, compassion, love and hope. We believe in a God who continues to call us back, no matter how often we stray.


Let us all try to be more Christ-like with a more loving, forgiving, compassionate attitude, and let us search for ways to make the Church better rather than dwelling at those things we find troublesome. Christ has come into the world many times over, and yet, our world is weary and waiting for Christ's coming again and again and again. We hear in today's first reading that God will raise up a prophet to speak God's word. Our world, and our Church, could use more prophets to rise up and speak God's words of challenge, mercy, conversion, love and hope. Let us rise up with courage and strength to be those prophets, to speak God's word.

Q. What's the deal with "tithing"?

"Tithe" is an Old English word which means 10% and is used to talk about contribution and distribution of goods. The original idea of tithing to the church started back in the early part of the Old Testament. Abraham's grandson Jacob was the father of twelve sons who started the tribes of Israel. In the beginning, all of them received a parcel of land to live off of and prosper with, except Levi. His line of Levites was the priesthood of the tribes. Rather than land, they received 10% of the prime crops and riches from the other tribes. Some faiths continue with this traditional thought of members contributing 10% of their gross wages to the church. The Catholic faith does not.

When I think of tithing, I recall the story of the poor widow who only gave a few copper coins into the collection, while wealthy individuals flaunted their large donations. Jesus states that this poor widow gave more, because even in her impoverished state she, gave all she had. The others gave from their abundance. This is what all of us are called to do. God has blessed us in so many ways and has given us so much, and only asks for so little back. It is our duty as Catholics to help keep our churches up and running, so we always have a place to worship and receive the Sacraments. It is also our duty to support those who have little and are not having their basic needs met.

Do we give from our surpluses or do we sacrifice now and then to help out more? Do we put too much importance spending on entertainment and luxuries because "we deserve to pamper ourselves", or do we give up comforts occasionally for the good of others?

"The point is this: he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that you may always have enough of everything and may provide in abundance for every good work.". (2 Corinthians 9:6-8)




