

YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

St. Joseph Corner

“Saint Joseph, foster father of Jesus Christ, took on the responsibility of raising Jesus as God instructed. Joseph gave up his home in order to protect his family and was able to make a new home wherever they went. For this reason, St. Joseph believers pray to him to help them find a new home or sell the home they have. It is believed that burying a statue of St. Joseph upside down in the ground will help your home sell faster. Once your home is sold, you are to remove the statue, otherwise it will sell over and over again. One story of how the tradition started claimed it was started by a nun named St. Teresa of Avila in the 1500s. She was having a difficult time finding land to start her new convent, and in order to find land, she told her nuns to pray to St. Joseph and bury blessed medals of him. Not long after, they found land for their new convent. Word got out about this and people started burying medals in their own yard in order to find a new home. They later started buying statues to bury in order to sell their property. This tradition still continues today.” - *(From Catholic 365.com)* Today many believe that the statue should be buried upside down and facing away from the home to be sold.

PASTORAL COLUMN

Scriptures: Gen 9:8-15; 1 Pt 3:18-22; Mk1:12-15

Traditionally, Lent is a time of repentance and conversion. We make an honest assessment of our lives, the good and the bad. We repent for the sins we have committed...the things we have done and the things we have failed to do...as we pray in the Confiteor during the Penitential Rite.

It is easy to identify the things we have done that are sinful. However, it can often take much more reflection to determine the things we have not done, that either cause harm or that prevent God's love from flourishing in our world. God has given each of us gifts and talents to use to share in the ministry of Jesus. All too often, we fail to do so out of ignorance, apathy, or just plain laziness. Lent is our next great opportunity to change, to be converted, to become aware of others' needs, and to work toward a better Church and world.

Perhaps there are lonely folks who would appreciate a visit, a card or a phone call. Are we too busy? Maybe you have a gift of music or song. Would you consider joining one of our choirs? Maybe you like repairing things and would be a blessing to our Building and Grounds Committees. If you like hospitality, you might enjoy helping with Donut Sunday, Hospitality Sunday, funeral dinners, etc. (post-pandemic). If you have a strong faith, have you ever thought about becoming a catechist to help spread the Gospel message? It could be that you have a strong sense of justice and mercy and would be a perfect fit for our Human Concerns Committees or our St. Vincent de Paul Chapters. These are just a few examples.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18-58 years of age. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

THE CURIOUS CATHOLIC

When we think of Lent, one of the first things that comes to mind for a lot of people is having to “give up” something. This can weigh heavily on people’s minds and come across as burdensome and depressing. But that’s not what fasting is meant to do. Fasting is actually a tool to help bring us closer to God and isn’t intended just for the season of Lent.

Fasting isn’t restricted to just food. You can also fast from bad habits, attitudes, and negative thoughts. Do you spend too much time on your phone or the computer? Do you have the habit of gossiping or always looking for the negative in people?

After Jesus was baptized, “*He was led into the wilderness by the Holy Spirit to be tempted by the devil. After fasting 40 days and 40 nights, he was hungry*” (Matthew 4: 1-2). When we read this passage, normally we want to focus on the word “hungry.” What we should focus on is the word “tempted”. In our human weakness, we focus on ourselves and our desires. We get so caught up in our daily routines, society’s influences, and over-scheduled lives, that we lose focus on practicing our faith. This is one of the tricks the devil uses to take our focus away from God. Fasting helps us to refocus.

Think about the things in your life that consume your thoughts and time. By fasting from those distractions, you are freeing yourself up to focus less on yourself and more on God. Lent isn’t supposed to be a time of sorrow, but rather a time of renewal. The word Lent comes from the Latin word “Lencten” which means springtime. Springtime is a time of new life and starting over. Let this Lent be your time of renewal. Fast from the things that take your thoughts and time away from God and renew your relationship with Him. Happy Fasting!
