## PASTORAL COLUMN

*Scriptures: Acts 2:1-11; 1 Cor. 12:3b-7,12-13; John 20:19-23*

Today's first reading recounts the story of the Holy Spirit descending upon the apostles, who are still gathered in the upper room. Imagine the events of the last several weeks: the crucifixion, resurrection, Christ's post-resurrection appearances and then the Ascension. They are scared, confused, and grieving the physical loss of their friend. They are not sure what to do next. They are surprised by a loud noise and tongues of fire as the Holy Spirit descends upon them and infuses them with courage, clarity and the proper words to go out and preach the message so everyone could understand them.

Pentecost reminds us that God is still in our midst in a very real and vital sense in the Holy Spirit. Pentecost reminds me of the many times that I have been afraid, confused and not sure what to do next. In those moments, God has always been there to grant me courage, clarity and the proper words that I could get my message across. This was as true in Ecuador (when I could only speak a little Spanish) as it was when I sat at the bedside of a dying parishioner or family member, or in making any difficult decision over the years.

What areas in our lives instill fear in you or confuse you? Maybe you have lost a loved one, a job, a house, or are facing a serious medical diagnosis or financial strain. Perhaps you are hoping for a baby and it's not happening. Maybe your last child is heading off to college and you face an empty nest. Perhaps you are facing a broken or seriously strained relationship.

There are many circumstances that can scare us or confuse us. In those times, I have always found that if I give my fear and concerns over to God, there is a sense of peace, similar to the peace Jesus offered the disciples. Asking God to handle the situation doesn't necessarily change the situation, but my outlook can definitely change. God is here with us today, as truly as He was more than 2000 years ago. Let us be more open to, and aware of, the presence of the Holy Spirit in our everyday lives. If we were all more in tune with the Holy Spirit, there would be a lot more peace in our world.

## THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

"In the Gospel of Matthew, St. Joseph is listed as the son of "Jacob" (Matthew 1:16). However, in the Gospel of Luke, his father is listed as "Heli" (Luke 3:23). Did Matthew and Luke have different information?

**Apologist Jimmy Akin** offers a plausible explanation that is accepted by many biblical scholars. *The second-century historian Julius Africanus, a native of Israel, records information given by Christ's remaining family in his day. According to their family genealogy, Joseph's grandfather Matthan (mentioned in Matthew) married a woman named Estha, who bore him a son named Jacob. After Matthan died, Estha married his relative Melchi (mentioned in Luke) and bore him a son named Heli (marrying relatives was common among Jews at this time). Jacob and Heli were thus half-brothers. Heli died childless, so Jacob married his widow and fathered Joseph, who was biologically the son of Jacob but legally the son of Heli (Eusebius, Ecclesiastical History 1:6:7).*

Adoption was common in Jewish culture and it directly affected the genealogical line. So while a person may be born into one specific lineage, if they were later adopted, they would also take on the new lineage. Additionally, as Akin explains, "Adoption could take place posthumously." This would mean that "If a man died childless, it was the duty of his brother to marry the widow and father a son on behalf of his brother. This son then would be posthumously 'adopted' by the dead man and reckoned as his son in the family genealogy."


## SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT de PAUL



## OUTREACH CORNER

**Laudato Si on Care for our Common Home, Pope Francis**

*"Authentic human development has a moral character. It presumes full respect for the human person, but it must also be concerned for the world around us and 'take into account the nature of each being and of its mutual connection in an ordered system.'" §5*

Over the past few weeks, I've been part of a group discussing *The Gift of Sunday* within our cluster. The document has been particularly insightful and focuses on the importance of keeping holy the Sabbath day. In reading *The Gift of Sunday* and *Laudato Si*, I was delighted to see how much the documents complement one another.

From violence to pollution and deforestation, discord within the created order is abundant. While I wouldn't have cited a disregard for the Sabbath day as the principal reason for this discord, after reading *The Gift of Sunday*, I would say it definitely plays a large part.

*"Our weekly participation in the Eucharistic celebration on the Lord's Day brings us into regular contact with a new pattern of communion that God desires to establish across the whole created order. This pattern consists of the combining of the fruits of creation, properly cared for and recognized as divine gifts, with the dignity of human labor, to produce the essential goods of earthly life. God in turn blesses these goods and elevates them, by infusing them with his very self, to bring about the mystical rejoining of heaven, earth, all of creation, and all of humanity in the communion of salvation."*

What a beautiful understanding of the Mass! It's no wonder, with the diminished attendance of Sunday worship and the increased commercialization of Sunday, why there is so much chaos in the world. Each person who observes the Sabbath day is another one of God's creatures that partakes in the unique communion that occurs in the Eucharistic celebration.
