HOLY CROSS ROOF UPDATE

Holy Cross Chapel is getting a new roof! The total cost of the project is \$100,250. PHD Roof Doctors, Inc will be performing the work, which includes a complete tear off and replacing it with a new architectural shingle roof system.

Some roofing materials have already been delivered. Unfortunately there are shipping delays with the balance of the material, which will delay the project until **July**. We will keep you posted once the start date is confirmed.

Funds to pay for the roof are being collected now and will also be incorporated with the upcoming Love One Another Capital Campaign, sponsored by the Milwaukee Archdiocese, set to kick off in November. PASTORAL COLUMN

Exodus 24:3-8; Hebrews 9:11-15; Mark 14:12-16,22-26

Today, we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. In today's first reading, we hear from the Book of Exodus. I don't know about all of you, but the thought of being sprinkled with the blood of young bulls is not very appealing to me. I much prefer our practice of being sprinkled with holy water.

In the Old Testament, we often read about sacrifice of animals and rituals of blood associated with them. The people of Moses' time had a unique understanding of blood. They knew that if something bled too much, it died. They didn't understand medicine, and did not have a developed theology of a soul or an afterlife. To them, blood meant life. By spilling the blood of an animal and sprinkling that blood upon themselves, they believed they were showing their deep commitment to God...a God they believed *wanted* them to sacrifice the life of animals to prove their devotion.

We know today that God isn't interested in us spilling the blood of animals to prove our dedication. Rather, we believe in a God who spilled **God's own blood** to prove God's love for *us*. People in Moses' time believed that the bigger the animal, the better the sacrifice. We know that the only perfect sacrifice came with Jesus' death on the cross.

That doesn't mean that we aren't called to sacrifice. We certainly are. Every Christian is called to sacrifice for his or her faith. We all do it in different ways. Perhaps, despite our very busy schedules, we make time to volunteer to help someone in need. Maybe we reach out to the sick, the bereaved, the homebound, those in nursing homes or in prison. Perhaps we organize fundraisers, or parish festivals, or serve on committees. Maybe we sacrifice by sharing our financial resources. Sometimes we are called to challenge those we love to live healthier lives. We also sacrifice by accepting the crosses that come our way: illness, job loss, broken relationships, deaths, aging, challenging job situations, etc. Many times, we sacrifice by foregoing things we'd like to do for those things that are best for the group or things that are a better choice for our lives.

As Catholic Christians, blood is still very important to us, but the most important blood is the blood of Jesus' sacrifice. We can participate in that on-going sacrifice by giving of the "blood" of our time, talent and treasure to those in need and to our parish.


THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

Q. What's the deal with Purgatory?

When I was in grade school, an aunt of mine re-carpeted her formal sitting room in a beautiful white carpet. If we were permitted to enter the room, we had to make sure our shoes were off and there were no dust or stains on any of our socks or clothing. I was a bit of a tomboy, so needless to say, I didn't spend much, if any, time in there. When I'm explaining purgatory to the students, I talk about my aunt's sitting room. I tell them to imagine the room as heaven, and the dirt and dust you carry on you is sin. There are those who have led a pure and holy life and died in a state of grace. They can enter right away. There are those who have died with mortal sins and had no desire to get clean. Those stains are permanent and they will never be allowed to enter the room. Then there are those of us who have died with a desire to be clean, but have fallen short. That dirt is temporary and needs more time to be removed.


The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, “**All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.**” (CCC 1030). There are several Scripture passages from both Old and New Testaments that supports the Catholic belief of purgatory. This is also why it is so important that we continue to pray on behalf of those who've passed away. Each prayer carries indulgences that help those who are in purgatory. So, it's never too late to pray for those who've perished. Especially for those who have no one to pray for them.
