## PASTORAL COLUMN

*Scriptures: Ez 2:2-5; 2 Cor 12:7-10; Mk 6:1-6a*

In today's Gospel, people begin asking a slew of derogatory questions about Jesus. They want to know, who the heck *HE* thinks he is that He feels qualified to teach them about the Jewish faith. He's a carpenter for crying out loud! Carpenters had no advanced education. They couldn't read or write. They may have memorized some Scripture passages, but that's about all they had going for them in the way of understanding the Scriptures. Or so these folks thought!

In Jesus' day, young men took over the profession of their father. Since Jesus' earthly father (the only one the people in the crowd knew of) was a carpenter, Jesus was expected to take over Joseph's profession.

In Jesus' culture, there was a great deal of emphasis placed on honor. Honor was either ascribed to, or acquired by, the individual. Ascribed honor was honor which one got because of who they were. They did not do anything to deserve this honor. Simply put, ascribed honor is inherited or appointed. Being born into an honorable family made one honorable. Ascribed honor could also be given by persons of power, such as God, or certain society leaders, like a king. Ascribed honor was honor received through blood or name, and was not limited like acquired honor. Ascribed honor was generally a collective concept – the entire family was considered honorable or not.

Acquired honor was honor that needed to be earned by individuals. This happened when society recognized that certain people had worth that exceeded that of others in the community. Acquired honor was a limited good and members of the first century Mediterranean communities competed for the available honor. There was only so much to go around, or at least that is what people believed. Therefore, when Jesus "rose above" his position in life and began teaching in the synagogue, the Jewish authorities felt like their honor had been stolen. When someone's honor was "attacked," they were expected to defend that honor. This is one of the many reasons that Jesus got into trouble during His ministry.

We also hear in the Gospel that Jesus was not able to perform many miracles because "He was amazed at their lack of faith." How many times do we pray about difficult circumstances in our life? Do we really have deep faith that God will help us? Even if God does not choose to change the situation, God can change US to better handle the situation. Let us have faith that God can handle our problems if we just let go and let God.

## CLUSTER VBS



## THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH



In Matthew's Gospel, the angel Gabriel appears to Joseph three times. (Incidentally, in Matthew's Gospel, there is no account of Gabriel appearing to Mary.) First, Gabriel comes to Joseph to tell him not to be afraid to take Mary for his wife, even though she was with child, because it was by the Holy Spirit that Mary conceived. Gabriel appears to Joseph a second time to warn him that King Herod has plans to kill the child Jesus, and that Joseph and his growing family should flee to Egypt. The third time the angel appears is when Gabriel tells Joseph that he should take his family to the land of Israel after King Herod's death.

## LAUDATO SI ON CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME, POPE FRANCIS

*"Greater scarcity of water will lead to an increase in the cost of food and the various products which depend on its use. Some studies warn that an acute water shortage may occur...unless urgent action is taken. The environmental repercussions could affect billions..." §21*

Hopefully, our recent drought has made us more vigilant about just how important water is to our daily lives and how necessary it is to conserve and protect it.

Here in the United States, we're privileged to not only have beautiful bodies of water that provide recreation, but plumbing that enables us to have easy access to potable water. This ease of access can make us think of water as an inexhaustible resource. This can lead to abuses of our water resources such as pollution from factory run off, widespread use of herbicides and pesticides, trash finding its way into our waterways, general overuse of water, etc.

In the United States, the devastating effects of water scarcity and pollution are not always readily apparent. Those living in developing nations who don't have access to plumbing and irrigation systems and rely on bodies of water for their everyday needs are often most affected. A shortage of water means crops may die leaving them with little food to eat or sell. Pollution makes it difficult to find water in which to drink and bathe.

Each of us can help ensure our waterways remain healthy and can continue to provide for the earth and its creatures. We can limit our use of plastic, recycle, use environmentally friendly pesticides and herbicides, be vigilant of our water consumption, take the time to appreciate the beauty of our waterways, and educate others on water conservation.

**Creation Care Corner** - This week's stewardship recommendation is **cool efficiently**. Making smart decisions about air conditioning can have a big effect on your utility bills, comfort, and air pollution. A dirty air filter slows down air flow and wastes energy. At a minimum, change the filter every three months in peak season. Close curtains or shades during the day on south and west facing windows for a 3-5% savings. A programmable thermostat can save you about \$180 every year in energy cost. No need to cool the house when you're gone. If air conditioning equipment is old and needs updating, consider replacing it with an Energy Star System for additional annual savings. Maintain your weather stripping and check insulation.

The program donates 10% of your total food purchase to the church of your choice.
