PASTORAL COLUMN

Scriptures: 1 Kgs 19:4-8; Eph 4:30-5:2; John 6:41-51

I think many of us can relate to Elijah in our first reading today. There have been stretches of time in our lives when the events we have had to endure can seem to be just too much to go on. There may be a serious and prolonged health diagnosis that completely saps our energy. Maybe a loved one has died, the grief is overwhelming, and the thought of living without that person can seem so impossible. Perhaps an unexpected job loss finds us struggling financially and having a hard time finding new employment. Maybe a fire, or severe damage from a natural disaster, has wiped out much of what we had owned.

It may be that an addiction (our own or a loved one's) has completely tapped our resources. Perhaps a couple has found it impossible to have a child for whom they have so hoped. Sometimes a number of disasters have been strung together and we find ourselves at the end of our rope, and maybe at the end of our hope. Whatever the case, so many of us have felt at least a little like Elijah: completely exhausted and wondering whether life was worth living any more. We want to give up.

During those times God sends us angels, just as he sent to Elijah. We don't always recognize them, but he sends them nonetheless. It could be a friend who sits with us at the hospital. It might be a coworker who picks up extra duties at work while we are dealing with our difficulties. It could be a financial donation, a greeting card in the mail, a tip on a new job or help tearing down the remains of a burned building. Maybe it's a neighbor who offers to cut our lawn, watch our children, provide rides to doctor appointments, serve a funeral luncheon or so many other kind gestures.

Each one of these actions, and many more, can be for us the hearth cake and jug of water that we need to give us the energy to walk our forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, just as Elijah did. Let us be more aware of those angels God sends us to nourish us when we are completely depleted by life.

And, just as importantly, let us be ever vigilant of those opportunities for us to be angels for others when they are in need of hope and help.

THE CURIOUS CATHOLIC

Q. Time for a sports break?

You may have noticed a slight change in your regular TV viewing schedule due to a little thing called the Summer Olympics. I thought this might be a good time to take a break from my regular question/answer segment and give a quick comment-"Terri" on "hurdles" (insert groan) we face in our faith life.

I look forward to the Olympics and enjoy watching the different athletic events. What I enjoy even more is listening to the stories of the individual athletes. Most of their stories are focused on struggles and obstacles they've had to overcome to make it to this world-renowned competition. One of my favorite stories is about a Scottish athlete named Eric Liddell. Eric was the son of missionaries who served in China. When Eric was six, he and his older brother were sent to a boarding school in London and only got to see his parents once every 7 years. He grew up a great athlete, but also a devoted Christian who put God at the center of his life. As a skilled runner he qualified for the 1924 Olympics. He was scheduled to run the 100m event, but refused because the event was held on a Sunday. He was called a traitor and ridiculed by his own country. Despite the criticism, he ran a 400m event later that week to win the gold. His story is highlighted in the movie, "Chariots of Fire."

Another more current Olympic athlete stated, *"I marched into St. James Church that Sunday in a line of teenagers with solemn faces... in a way, our procession reminded me of a medal ceremony, except that no gold, silver, and bronze medals would be given out. Instead, our prize would be something much more powerful: in a few moments, each of us would bow our heads to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation."* The name of this athlete... Simone Biles, gold medal gymnast. Other "Cath-letes" from this year's Olympics include, Grace McCallum (gymnast), Sydney McLaughlin and Matthew Centrowitz Jr. (track), Molly Seidl (distance), Skylar Diggins-Smith and Sue Bird (basketball), Katie Ledecky (swimming), Amanda Chidester (softball), and Mariel Zagunis (fencing). Besides their Catholic faith and amazing athleticism, these athletes share something else in common. All of them state that they couldn't have made it as far as they had without their faith to lean on and God to guide them.

Philip Rivers, who just recently retired as quarterback for the San Diego Chargers states, "I love to play football but wanted to be able to attend Mass as well. I was able to do that by going to a vigil Mass or an early Sunday morning one. Without it, I wouldn't have been the football player, husband and father that I am."

The reason I decided to write about these athletes is because of the amazing examples they set for us. All of us have commitments, overscheduled lives, and struggles that can turn into excuses for the lack of time we give to God. We tend to take our faith for granted. It's easy to put God farther down our list of priorities because we know that He is always there whenever we need Him. It's like we treat God as an instruction manual and will pull Him off the shelf and dust Him off, when we decide that we need Him. What these athletes have taught us, is that God needs to be in the center of our lives. Life is like a sporting event and we can't finish the race if we don't exercise our baptismal promises and strengthen our prayer life. The only way to reach that heavenly finish line is with God as our coach. If we do that, we are guaranteed the gold.

Creation Care Corner - Ask Congress to Act on Climate Change. In 2019, the US Conference of Catholic Bishops issued a statement of support for legislation to address climate change. It's called the **Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act**. Some Dioceses and parishes have asked their parishioners to write or call their Congressional Representatives to support the bill. This legislation puts a small but annually increasing fee on fossil fuel energy producers for their carbon emissions. The fee is returned to every American households as a monthly dividend check to offset future fossil fuel price increases. This legislation will trigger massive investments in clean energy, which will quickly become cheaper than fossil fuels, leading to an orderly market transition to non-polluting energy. This will save lives, create jobs avoid billions in environmental damage while reducing greenhouse gases, without harming the poor or Middle class. **This site will help you write a Catholic message and send it to your congressman:**
