PASTORAL COLUMN

Scriptures: Rev. 11:19a; 12:106a, 10ab; 1 Cor. 15:20-27; Luke 1:39-56

The Gospel reading for the Assumption begins with “Mary set out and traveled to the hill country *in haste*...” I bet she did! Can you imagine how Mary must have felt? I often wonder if she struggled to tell her parents and Joseph the news of her pregnancy even though she knew her child was divine. She had to know that her parents and Joseph would feel a good deal of embarrassment and shame. What would the people in the village think of her? It sure was a convenient time to skip town! I even wonder if her parents sent her out of town to visit Elizabeth. Even if they believed Mary’s explanation, they still would have wanted to save embarrassment placed on her by gossiping villagers.


I am reminded of the young women (and men) I have walked with who have found themselves with an unexpected pregnancy. Some have chosen life and some have made the other choice. There is a common thread with those who made the other choice. None of the women I’ve known in that situation *wanted* to end their baby’s life. Rather, they’ve made that choice because they have felt unsupported, ridiculed, ostracized and even shamed. Many know that a high percentage of women who give birth alone live in poverty for the rest of their lives and their children as well. Many don’t have health insurance. Some are unemployed or have unsupportive families and friends. I have seen young people’s agonizing struggle to make a decision for life. All the women I’ve walked with *want* to make the right choice. Some of them ultimately choose abortion, and it is always heart-breaking. It’s never an easy choice and people who think women make this choice frivolously are terribly wrong.

We do a lot to fight for the rights of the unborn: donate to Right for Life groups, vote for candidates that respect the dignity of all human beings from birth to natural death, and fight for laws that do the same. These are all good things to do, but there is more we can do. Sometimes the “other things” hold just as much or more importance as we fight for the unborn.

If we choose not to judge them, they may not feel so ashamed. If we are willing to be an on-going support (not just until the birth, but after it as well), these young people may be able to find the courage to choose life. If we build a society where we all live the belief that every human being at every stage of life has equal dignity precisely because each of us are created in God’s image, more women will choose life. The little choices we make on a regular basis can go far in contributing to a woman’s decision to choose life. Know this: YOU *can* save a baby’s life.

LAUDATO SI ON CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME, POPE FRANCIS

"we need only take a frank look at the facts to see that our common home is falling into serious disrepair. Hope would have us recognize that there is always a way out, that we can always redirect our steps, that we can always do something to solve our problems." §35

Hope is beautiful and has helped many a person through difficult times. However, in the case of caring for our common home, it can cause us to defer responsibility to future generations or may cause us to apply a false silver lining to things rather than facing the grim reality.

Sometimes, it is in our best interest to confront the grim reality. While earth has some amazing regenerative properties, there are damages that go beyond repair. Creatures have gone extinct, reefs and rainforests have been destroyed, and animals and people have lost their lives due to environmental damage caused largely by human greed, laziness, and ignorance. The unnecessary loss of a creature, or worse, an entire species, is not something to be taken lightly. Every creature occupies a special place on this earth, and in God's heart, and its existence is connected to that of all creatures, including humans, and to the overall wellbeing of the earth.

In the United States, we're somewhat sheltered from the devastating effects of pollution. We have plumbing and treatment plants that provide us with clean water. We're able to purchase food from grocery stores rather than subsist on raising our own food by tilling the land.

We must ditch the "hope" that gives us an excuse to sit back and wait for future generations to solve the problem. Instead, we must embrace the real hope that demands we use our God-given reason to work toward lasting solutions that address environmental concerns.

We need not hold any special degree to be part of the solution. We can reduce our water and energy consumption, be mindful of how much non-biodegradable waste we produce, reuse and/or recycle items when they have served their purpose. We can also buy local, reducing the pollution caused by transporting items, or even plant our own garden. We can purchase sustainably sourced and Fair Trade items to support our earth and the laborers who work it. Be sure to get outside, enjoy creation, and perhaps, take some time to read Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si*.

The thirteenth annual St Mary Foundation Little Kohler get together will be held on August 18 starting with a Rosary at 12:00 pm and a pot luck dinner to follow the Rosary. All are welcome. Please bring a dish to pass and whatever drinks you desire. Come and meet some of our past priests and parishioners.

Creation Care Corner - This week's stewardship recommendation is to reduce outdoor watering waste. Experts estimate that 50 percent of the water we use outdoors goes to waste from evaporation, wind, or runoff due to overwatering. Frequent lawn watering is expensive and often unnecessary. A typical lawn only needs about one inch of water per week to survive. So if there is no rain, water every 6-8 days to reduce your water bill. A best practice: water for 15 minutes then allow the water to soak in for a while and repeat 3-4 times, lessening waste of water runoff. This deeper soaking technique encourages the roots to grow deeper and be more drought resistant. Water early in the morning or at sunset to reduce loss from evaporation. Check the spigots for leaks.


