

2/7 Jim Baumann:

Good Writing Skill: Not Just Diagramming Sentences

Early in his career as a newspaper editor, Jim Baumann realized that simply correcting someone's writing errors didn't address the problem. To help his staff improve their craft, he initiated quizzes and spelling tests in an educational process that used humor rather than red-lining or lecturing.

Encouraged to expand his audience outside the newsroom, Baumann developed a column, "Grammar Moses", which has become an ongoing conversation with readers. Baumann doesn't consider himself a grammar expert, but rather a hobbyist and enthusiast. Many of these columns have now been incorporated into his book Grammar Moses: A humorous look at grammar and usage.

Baumann, a second-generation suburban journalist, grew up in Arlington Heights and attended Prospect High School. After graduating from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, he joined the Daily Herald as an intern in 1983. He was named managing editor in 2012. After four years as a reporter, he assumed various editing positions for the DuPage and Fox Valley editions. In 2012, he became Managing Editor, and a corporate Vice President in 2016. In November 2021, he was named Executive Editor.



This upcoming Martin Luther King holiday may be America's most important one yet. On the heels of 2020 and 2021, in which we saw the greatest racial reckoning in America since the 1960s, a historic national election, a pandemic that killed over 700,000 citizens, and Great Depression level unemployment, the issues posed by Dr. King's work could not be more critical.

Earlier this year, the nation inaugurated Joe Biden, our 46th president, in a fervent attempt to radically shift the direction of the Trump years. In a whirlwind package of executive orders in his first few hours on the job, President Biden immediately revoked Trump's 1776 Report, announced on MLK day. This report and educational plan were an effort to push Trump-sanctioned "patriotic education" designed to minimize the impact of US slavery.

Although Biden is charting a new and refreshing course in this nation, over 70 million Americans thought our previous leadership represented them. This nation is truly at a crossroads. Will we judge ourselves strictly by the economic and social successes of a few or by the persistent suffering and exclusion of millions? Will we judge ourselves by the "content of our character?"



In this important week, we must stop and ask the question, can we overcome? The perception of America as the land of opportunity is in great jeopardy. Although pockets of opportunity have existed for many, the United States has never truly been close to fulfilling its founding promises. As Dr. King said, "America has given the Negro people a bad check, a check which has come back marked 'insufficient funds." The ugly scars of injustice and inequality are a persistent part of the American identity rather than the anomaly that many like to believe.

America has perpetuated a multigenerational caste system that would put nations like India to shame. According to the Economic Policy Institute, US mobility is among the lowest of major industrialized economies. Our dirty little secret is that the income and educational level of a person's parents has a tremendous impact on their life chances. The idea that millions of Americans pick themselves up by their bootstraps and move drastically beyond where their parents landed is increasingly a myth. However, millions cling tightly to what is possible.

It is the reason that generations of marginalized groups have continued to hope beyond hope. In Dr. King's final speech he says, "All we say to America is, 'Be true to what you said on paper.'

If I lived in China or even Russia, or any totalitarian country, maybe I could understand the denial of certain basic First Amendment privileges because they hadn't committed themselves to that over there. But somewhere I read of the freedom of assembly. Somewhere I read of the freedom of speech. Somewhere I read of the press. Somewhere I read that the greatness of America is the right to protest for right."

Dr. King is truly an American hero. We should celebrate this fact. Yet, if we remember his role as a dreamer, and forget his role as a social agitator, spiritual prophet, and champion for the disaffected, we will miss the very purpose of his work. In 2022 as the Biden administration picks up the pieces of a broken nation, we can never forget the continued relevance of Dr. King's unfinished mission.

### Grief Support Ministry, HealingTogether@Home

Because we are not meeting in-person for our regular Old St. Pat's Grief Support Group, Companions on the Journey, we have created a grief support group that meets remotely utilizing the Zoom meeting platform. Healing Together@Home has been organized for those who are grieving the death of a loved one: parent, spouse, partner, sibling, family member, friend... It hurts!



You may be experiencing some of the most powerful and painful feelings of your life. The many feelings of grief may seem uncomfortable and threatening to you. And, sadly, there are too few people who want to talk to you about this pain. Support groups provide an opportunity for grieving persons to better understand the wide range of feelings and behaviors associated with grief. More importantly, support groups offer a safe place where people can come together for mutual support, and to learn that their feelings are normal and that one need not be alone.

Our program is offered free of charge over the course of seven consecutive weeks. Our groups are small by design so that they are comfortable and informal. We plan to schedule the next program on Wednesday, January 26th and end on March 16th (with March 2nd excluded due to Ash Wednesday) from 6:30pm to 8:00pm.







### IMMIGRANT AND REFUGEES: A Faith Journey

Did you ever wonder why Jesus would say this to his mother?
We find delight in her answer, not to Jesus, but directed to the servers:
"Do whatever he tells you." They knew it was time to listen to her.
She knew it was time for her son to begin. And immigrants and refugees are telling us it is time too, time to act for change. Maybe in our bubble it is not our concern. But the plight of immigrants and refugees, of people of color, of families trying to escape violence and poverty...it should concern us because it reveals a flaw in our humanity and country that must be changed.

Interfaith Immigration Coalition (IIC) tells us that despite widespread criticism of "Remain in Mexico," the policy was restarted in the first days of 2022. Migrants in San Diego, CA are being returned to Tijuana, and in El Paso, TX, "Remain in Mexico" court hearings begin for those newly subjected to the revived policy. 




### Faith and Racial Healing: Embracing Truth, Justice, and Restoration

### Women and Men of Faith



Saint Berard and Companions Saint of the Day for January 16

Preaching the gospel is often dangerous work. Leaving one's homeland and adjusting to new cultures, governments and languages is difficult enough; but martyrdom caps all the other sacrifices.

In 1219, with the blessing of Saint Francis, Berard left Italy with Peter, Adjute, Accurs, Odo and Vitalis to preach in Morocco. En route in Spain, Vitalis became sick and commanded the other friars to continue their mission without him.

They tried preaching in Seville, then in Muslim hands, but made no converts. They went on to Morocco where they preached in the marketplace. The friars were immediately apprehended and ordered to leave the country; they refused. When they began preaching again, an exasperated sultan ordered them executed. After enduring severe beatings and declining various bribes to renounce their faith in Jesus Christ, the friars were beheaded by the sultan himself on January 16, 1220.

These were the first Franciscan martyrs. When Francis heard of their deaths, he exclaimed, "Now I can truly say that I have five Friars Minor!" Their relics were brought to Portugal where they prompted a young Augustinian canon to join the Franciscans and set off for Morocco the next year. That young man was Anthony of Padua. These five martyrs were canonized in 1481.






