

2/3 Jim Baumann:

Good Writing Skill: Not Just Diagramming Sentences

Early in his career as a newspaper editor, Jim Baumann realized that simply correcting someone's writing errors didn't address the problem. To help his staff improve their craft, he initiated quizzes and spelling tests in an educational process that used humor rather than red-lining or lecturing.

Encouraged to expand his audience outside the newsroom, Baumann developed a column, "Grammar Moses", which has become an ongoing conversation with readers. Baumann doesn't consider himself a grammar expert, but rather a hobbyist and enthusiast. Many of these columns have now been incorporated into his book *Grammar Moses: A humorous look at grammar and usage*.

Baumann, a second-generation suburban journalist, grew up in Arlington Heights and attended Prospect High School. After graduating from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, he joined the Daily Herald as an intern in 1983. He was named Managing Editor in 2012. After four years as a reporter, he assumed various editing positions for the DuPage and Fox Valley editions. In 2012, he became Managing Editor, and a corporate Vice President in 2016. In November 2021, he was named Executive Editor.

Old St. Pat's Divorce Recovery Support Group

Next Session Starts Monday, February 21st We meet virtually through Zoom 6:00 pm - 7:30 pm

The divorce process often brings about unexpected and unimaginable heartache, questions, and challenges. It is an especially vulnerable time due to the pandemic. Divorce Recovery was created to bring hope and healing to those who have experienced the pain and loneliness of a broken marriage. Sessions include education, discussion, and prayer. Each meeting focuses on a different aspect of the divorce healing process such as grief, stress, anger, blame, guilt, loneliness, family issues, forgiveness, and happiness.

Our mission is to help get you started and keep you going on the path to rebuilding and renewal by providing information, resources, and encouragement. It will help answer questions, restore hope, and begin authentic healing. More importantly, process groups offer a safe place where people can come together for mutual support and to learn their feelings are normal and they're not alone.

Divorced men and women are welcome to attend. It is for those recently divorced, as well as those still struggling with issues many years later. All ages are welcome. You do not need to be a member of Old St. Pat's to participate. All faiths are welcome. The support group is facilitated by a licensed therapist.



In today's Gospel, Jesus is driven out of Nazareth. He is not accepted in his own town. He is a refugee.

According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops migrants, refugees, and travelers include "people on the move such as: mariners and fishers, airport workers and travelers, circus and traveling show folks and migrant farm workers." Thus, all who "lack acceptance in their native place" are like Jesus and worthy of the special welcome the Church offers to the stranger.


We will meet on the 2nd Monday of every month from 5:30pm -7:00pm.



Women and Men of Faith



Blessed Mary Angela Truszkowska Saint of the Day for January 30

Today we honor a woman who submitted to God's will throughout her life—a life filled with pain and suffering.

Born in 1825 in central Poland and baptized Sophia, she contracted tuberculosis as a young girl. The forced period of convalescence gave her ample time for reflection. Sophia felt called to serve God by working with the poor, including street children and the elderly homeless in Warsaw's slums. In time, her cousin joined her in the work.

In 1855, the two women made private vows and consecrated themselves to the Blessed Mother. New followers joined them. Within two years, they formed a new congregation, which came to be known as the Felician Sisters. As their numbers grew, so did their work, and so did the pressures on Mother Angela (the new name Sophia took in religious life).

Mother Angela served as superior for many years until ill health forced her to resign at the age of 44. She watched the order grow and expand, including missions to the United States among the sons and daughters of Polish immigrants.

Pope John Paul II beatified Mother Angela in 1993. Her liturgical feast is celebrated on October 10.




