From Faith to Constructive Action By: Vincent Guider

"Thoughts and prayers are not enough; it's time to do something!" Many people in my circle are quick to say how appalled they are by the rising crime rate. We hear similar sentiments in media interviews, in quotes by political candidates, at public gatherings, in the press and all over. Everywhere you turn, there seems to be unanimous agreement that it's time to do something" I'll second that, yes we need to spring into action right now.

Three weeks ago I was really proud of myself for finally setting time aside to clean out a walk-in closet that had gotten a bit disorganized over time. It had a three year build up of clothes, small furniture, unfinished projects and other assorted mess that I had just tossed in, expecting to sort it all out some day in the future, when I had more time to focus on it. I had continuously placed items in but I was not being diligent enough about organizing them or gradually taking things out. Now, I meant well. I always believed I'd get the job done some day. I had that faith.

Though I had the faith, the faith was not enough to get the job done. The action was missing. It wasn't until I decided to watch one less program on Netflix, hold one less phone conversation and browse one less website so I would have time to roll up my sleeves and bend down to clean out that closet that I made the progress that was so sorely needed. I finally got that assorted junk out of there. What progress! What a relief it was! It wasn't until I moved myself beyond mere faith that I accomplished what was needed. That rather insignificant incident in my closet is a reminder to me that Jesus admonished, "Faith without works is dead faith", James 2:26.

Surely, Jesus was not talking about house chores or other such mundane tasks, but rather about matters of kinship with our sisters and brothers. It is incumbent on each of us to actively work at cleaning up the violence, racism, indifference, greed, abuse, misogyny, silence, bigotry, indifference and every other manner of evil that threatens to divide us, less these pile up and overwhelm us. It's a big task and a not very pleasant one, but one that must and can be done. And the best way to do it is to first believe it needs to be done, and then roll up our sleeves and dive in.

The Old St. Patrick's faith community is praying for these educators and the young scholars whom they serve, and we actively support their vital mission.








A Movement of Synodality

March 31 | Thursday "With Jesus before them, it was still hard to believe." [See Jn 5:31 – 47] Receive the sacrament of reconciliation and do penance for those who abuse immigrants and refugees seeking asylum.





Green Notes from OSP Green Team: The Plastic Pollution Problem (and What We Can Do about it)

"The solution to prevent plastic waste... could be accomplished with improved waste management and recycling, better product design that takes into account the short life of disposable packaging, and reduction in manufacturing of unnecessary single use plastics."

People across the world are becoming more concerned about plastic pollution as a major environmental issue. Plastic waste is now found across the globe, from the heights of Mt. Everest, the world's highest mountain, to the depths of the Mariana Trench, the world's deepest oceanic trench. Henderson Island, an uninhabited atoll in the Pacific Ocean between Chile and New Zealand, now has plastic trash from Russia, the United States, South American, Europe, Japan, and China. The oceans are the ultimate sink for plastic trash. 8 million tons of plastic waste end up in oceans each year: the equivalent of 5 garbage bags of trash for every foot of coastline.

But plastic trash also remains for hundreds of years in inland spaces, where it threatens wildlife. Plastic string and netting entangle fish, turtles, and wildlife of all kinds. Animals eat plastic because it looks like food to them; but it provides no nutrition, and can block their intestines. Very fine plastic particles have entered our drinking water, with unknown effects on our health, and have even been found in beer.

In our country, one issue is media portrayal of how plastics fit into everyday life. A recent study of 32 popular TV drama shows revealed that use of plastics was pervasive on these shows, with an average of 28 single use plastics per show (predominately bags, water bottles and straws). But 93% of this plastic was not disposed of onscreen, and 80% of the plastic that was disposed of ended up as litter. This type of portrayal promotes the sense that plastic disappears on its own, and littering is ok. You can view the full study at this link: **bit.ly/FlipTheScriptReport**

So, what can we do to limit plastic pollution? Consider these steps.

- Reduce your own use of plastics. Carry reusable shopping bags and containers for carry out in your car. Use reusable water bottles and travel mugs. Say no thanks to plastic straws, unless you need them. Support businesses that don't use plastic bags and packaging.
- Reuse single use plastics when possible. You can find many creative ideas for reuse online. For example, make a laundry detergent bottle into a watering can by poking holes in the cap.
- Know your city's recycling rules so can recycle what your city allows, and discard what cannot be recycled. Take advantage of the plastic bag recycling offered by many supermarkets in the area. - Research and support public policy that reduces plastic pollution, like Chicago's plastic bag ordinance.


Plastics have only been around for about 100 years, and in that time have revolutionized modern life. Plastics have saved human lives through the use of helmets; reduced fuel and pollution by making cars, trucks and airplanes lighter; and given us longer, healthier lives by altering how medicine is practiced. But we can't live in a world awash in plastic trash. If we revamp our use of plastics, we can realize the benefits of plastics without the burden of pollution.

Women and Men of Faith



Saint Gregory of Narek Saint of the Day for March 27, 2022

Gregor was born in a village on the shores of Lake Van between 945 and 950. His father, an archbishop died around xx. When his mother died Gregor and his older brother were raised by a scholarly uncle who had them educated at the Narek monastery where he was a monk. The monastery was a prominent center of learning located in what is now Turkey. Gregor too entered the monastery and was ordained in 977.

A professor of theology, Gregor wrote a mystical interpretation of the Song of Songs, and a long mystical poem called the Book of Prayer or the Book of Lamentations. He described his poem as "an encyclopedia of prayer for all nations." This classic of Armenian literature has been translated into 30 languages. The Russian text of the Book of Lamentations was set to music in 1985.

Little else is known about Gregor, other than he died in the early 11th century and was buried within the walls of the Narek monastery where he had spent his life. In 2015 as the world observed the 100th anniversary of the Armenian genocide in the Ottoman Empire, Pope Francis concelebrated a Mass at the Vatican with Patriarch Nerses Bedros XIX Tarmouni and declared the monk, poet, and saint of the Armenian Apostolic Church, Gregory of Narek, a Doctor of the Church. His liturgical feast is celebrated on February 27.


