#### The World That is Ours

On May 14, 2022, a gunman used an AR-15, high-capacity assault weapon to murder 10 Black Americans at a Buffalo grocery store, wounding two bystanders. Civil authorities say the 18-year-old suspect traveled hours to carry out his rampage, apparently leaving behind a manifesto filled with white supremacist ideology, including the vile conspiracy theory that people of color are "replacing" white Americans. In 2019, a gunman shot up a Walmart in Texas after complaining of a "Hispanic invasion of Texas."

In a statement last week, Cardinal Cupich remarked, "Whatever the theory, white supremacism is a lie. This ideology is not always so explicitly expressed, but it is condemnable whether it hides behind slippery political rhetoric or does not bother with any fig leaves of deniability." Pax Christi, the National Catholic Peace movement, wrote in a statement last week: What happened in Buffalo is only the most egregious, the most obvious manifestation of the white supremacy that the \*Pax Christi Anti-Racism Team warned in 1999 "perpetrates deep spiritual and social brokenness and endangers creation." It is impossible for anyone within the Christian community – from which this poisoned branch grew – to be silent on the insidious, destructive power of white nationalism within the U.S. today.

This past Tuesday, May 24, a gunman entered a grade school in Uvalde, Texas and shot and killed 19 children and two teachers. His motive is not yet understood, but unimaginable grief lies in the wake of this massacre. But, then again, this grief is deeply known by the dozens of parents and grandparents, classmates and friends of the 43 people killed by guns in Chicago in the first 25 days of May this year.

Again, Cardinal Cupich shared a statement that included these words: As I reflect on this latest American massacre, I keep returning to the questions: Who are we as a nation if we do not act to protect our children? What do we love more: our instruments of death or our future?

White supremacy, gun violence, war - these are the issues of our time, our world, our nation, and our neighborhoods. It would seem that, for those who consider themselves to be followers or friends of Jesus, prayerful action is not optional - it is inherent to our way of being human and engaging the world.

As we approach Pentecost, we pray:

Come, Holy Spirit.
Grow in us the spirit of understanding
as we face the complicated roots of violence.
Give us courage and right judgment to innovate and act:
building households, neighborhoods, cities of peace.
Give us fortitude for this long journey in front of us,
and nourish us in community
and the sacrament of
the Prince of Peace.
Come, Holy Spirit.

## Why Kinship? A Frustration-Filled Rant By: Vincent Guider

Here's what we really need at this moment in our nation. It's Kinship. This is exactly what Jesus calls us to over and over and over again in the scriptures. Us being united, caring and invested with one another is the polar opposite of the disturbingly inhumane behavior we are seeing and hearing about so frequently in the news these days. There are too many guns, too much military hardware, so many laws, multiple political and social ideologies, various factions and countless opinions that keep us suspicious, angry and divided. I am sickened by mass shootings, violence, racial injustices and discrimination of all sorts, the criminal behavior and just general chaos we are witnessing. We, as a society, can do much better.

Pious calls for thoughts and prayers is not enough; it's time for a reckoning. Action is required. Our getting up and out to encounter, learn, vote, converse, serve, invest and set transformational policies is what we need to begin leveling the listing ship of our society. This is our collective mission as citizens, as disciples. Herein is the work of God's Kingdom, and it requires us to be in kinship with one another.

Kinship is about relationships. It puts us in proximate, respectful and hopefully intimate human exchanges. It causes us to leave our comfort zones, to open ourselves, to see and think differently. It allows us to risk engaging rather than sitting on the sidelines comfortably passive, detached or apathetic. It makes us present. We listen more than talk. We share rather than hoard. We expose ourselves to possible disappointment and perhaps even hurt to support and elevate others. Our baptismal call is about so much more than simply attending Mass, thinking and praying about things we wish we could change. The waters of baptism, our Christian faith and the Old St. Patrick's Mission and vision are rallying cries to get up, go out and be the transformation we hope to see and so desperately need.

In an impassioned plea for change, Fannie Lou Hamer, the voting and civil rights activist, spoke up for African-Americans living under the South's Jim Crow rules. She once famously said, "I am sick and tired of being sick and tired!" Fannie, so am I, and so are a lot of others too.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus prolifically spoke about unity when he said:

"I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one.

I in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity.

Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me."

— John 17:22

So I ask myself, "Why Kinship?" The answer I arrive at is this. It's about us being unified with Christ and each other, and working together to make the Kingdom what it can truly be. This is the only way we can make things right. Kinship is love in action.





## Asylum Seekers must return to Mexico while awaiting a court hearing ... Write to Congress Today





The Migrant Protection Protocols (MPP), also known as "Remain in Mexico," forces asylum seekers to return to Mexico after they've petitioned the US for safety and remain there while they await a court hearing. Since the program was first implemented, migrants have been forced to wait for up to two years. The implementation of this policy along with the implementation of Title 42 endangers the lives of many migrants.

While living in limbo in Mexico, migrants often become targets for the organized crime that exists in that country. It's very common to hear from migrants that they've been victims of kidnappings, human trafficking, sexual assault, and extortion. According to *Human Rights First*, at least 9,886 kidnappings, torture, rape, and other violent attacks have occurred on people blocked in or expelled to Mexico due to the Title 42 policy under the Biden administration – a new record of suffering.

President Biden wants to end these cruel policies but members of Congress are trying to keep them in place. Write to your members of Congress today to urge them to terminate MPP & Title 42 and instead create policies that welcome migrants with compassion and dignity.





#### Women and Men of Faith



Saint Madeleine Sophie Barat Saint of the Day for May 29, 2022

The legacy of Madeleine Sophie Barat can be found in the more than 100 schools operated by her Society of the Sacred Heart, institutions known for the quality of the education made available to the young.

Sophie herself received an extensive education, thanks to her brother Louis, 11 years older and her godfather at baptism. Himself a seminarian, Louis decided that his younger sister would likewise learn Latin, Greek, history, physics and mathematics—always without interruption and with a minimum of companionship. By age 15, she had received a thorough exposure to the Bible, the teachings of the Fathers of the Church and theology. Despite the oppressive regime Louis imposed, young Sophie thrived and developed a genuine love of learning.

Meanwhile, this was the time of the French Revolution and of the suppression of Christian schools. The education of the young, particularly young girls, was in a troubled state. Sophie, who had discerned a call to the religious life, was persuaded to become a teacher. She founded the Society of the Sacred Heart, which focused on schools for the poor as well as boarding schools for young women of means. Today, co-ed Sacred Heart schools also can be found, along with schools exclusively for boys.

In 1826, her Society of the Sacred Heart received formal papal approval. By then she had served as superior at a number of convents. In 1865, she was stricken with paralysis; she died that year on the feast of the Ascension.

Madeleine Sophie Barat was canonized in 1925. Her liturgical feast is celebrated on May 25.




