MINISTRY SCHEDULES



Holy Family Parish is very blessed to be able to offer daily Mass most days of the week. What is the benefit of daily Mass? To start your day slowly, in the presence of our Lord, getting to receive Him in the Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist, what better way to start your day? There's no better way to put God first than to start your day at Mass. Daily Mass is usually scheduled at 8:00 AM, Tuesdays - Fridays. 
OUR LADY OF FATIMA PILGRIM STATUE

CHRIST OUR LIFE



CERTIFICATE OF CHURCH MANAGEMENT

As disciples of Jesus Christ, we are called to be responsible stewards of the human, financial, and organizational resources entrusted to our care. The Villanova School of Business is offering a Certificate in Church Management after participants complete 12 - 90 minute webinars and reflection papers.
