

FATHER JOHN STACK



Some sixty years ago John Stack was born the fourth child of George and Joan Stack in Davenport. Their oldest child Tom was nine years older, Cheryl was seven years older and Dan was five years older. His father and mother were transplants to Iowa having been south side Chicago Irish. George worked for the Rock

Island lines since returning from World War II and in the mid 1950's was transferred from Lasalle Street Station to Rock Island IL.

His Mother was the oldest of five girls, and very much missed her sisters, so weekends, school holidays and summers were spent with his family in Chicago. John developed very strong ties with extended family and among the cousins was known to be very competitive. Baseball was his favorite daytime sport, with Risk, Monopoly or any card game for nighttime competitions.

The family really had a typical 1960's development enjoying major summer vacations to Florida to see the Ocean, the Gulf, space program, bush gardens for exotic animals; California to see "the other ocean," Catalina Island, television city and Hollywood. Utah for the Great Salt Lake and Arizona for the Grand Canyon. Nevada for mining, Hoover dam, but mostly for dear neighbors who had been relocated to Reno and were missed.

In 1965 a man from Muscatine Iowa came to see George at his office at the Rock Island depot in Davenport. He was opening a new company and wondered if Dad would work for him running the transportation department? My father came home that night and told my mother that a customer who ran a pump company in Muscatine offered him a job today. He said he'd double my salary. Mom was adamant dad should take the job! Dad was reluctant thinking that he ought not be so fast in giving up railroad retirement and he wasn't sure this guy wouldn't go belly up in a year. Mom prevailed and made Dad take the job. She also called a contractor and built the only family home I've ever known. Dad got in on the ground floor of Bandag and would retire an officer some 25 years later, owing to being hired by Roy Carver. He would spend those 25 years commuting every business day to Muscatine as mom thought Davenport was too small compared to Chicago and Muscatine never had a chance.

VOCATIONS CORNER

"In Old Age they Still Bear fruit (Psalm 92:15)

Celebrating the Vocation of a Grandparent and the Elderly

"Our vocation is to preserve our roots, to pass on the faith to the young and to care for the little ones," said Pope Francis. "There is no retirement age from the work of proclaiming the Gospel and handing down traditions to your grandchildren," he added. Wanting to recognize the important vocation of a Grandparent and elderly, Pope Francis established a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly which took place for the first time on Sunday, July 25, 2021. In 2022, the celebration will fall on Sunday, July 24, the Sunday closest to the Feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, Grandparents of Jesus. The theme chosen by Pope Francis for this year's celebration is: "In old age they will still bear fruit" (Psalm 92:15).

Next Sunday July 24, we invite families to include their grandparents or elderly friends or neighbors to join them in their church pew in celebration. If they cannot attend Mass in person, make plans on a time to visit them during the weekend. This year, Pope Francis announced several grants of indulgences for those taking part in the second World Day for Grandparents and the elderly. A plenary indulgence, which may also be obtained in suffrage for the souls in Purgatory, is granted:

- to grandparents, the elderly, and the faithful who, motivated by a true spirit of penance and charity, will participate on July 24th in the solemn celebration that Pope Francis will preside over in the Vatican, or in the various functions that take place throughout the world;
- to the faithful who, on the same day, devote adequate time to visit, in person or virtually through the media, their disabled brothers and sisters in need or in difficulty (such as the sick, the abandoned, or the disabled)
- to the sick, elderly, and all those who, unable to leave their homes for a serious reason, will unite spiritually with the sacred services of the World Day, offering to the Merciful God their prayers, the pains and sufferings of their lives, especially while the words of the Supreme Pontiff and the various celebrations are broadcast through the media.

The grants of indulgence, "from the heavenly treasures of the Church," are made under the usual conditions of sacramental Confession, Eucharistic confession, and prayers for the intentions of the Pope.
