

FATHER JOHN STACK



Perhaps by providence Tom began to involve his little brother in his projects. It started innocently with Tom being a devoted lowa Hawkeye fan and needing to be at Kinnick Stadium for Hawkeye games, which interfered with his obligation of teaching sixth grade religious education. His solu-

tion was to tell the parish director of religious education [who turned out to be John's former high school counselor who got him the meat market job] that "my little brother will be my substitute."

The invitation was almost comical with the older brother proposing the notion and the younger brother saying, "what do I know about teaching 12 year-olds old testament?"" You are the best storyteller I know! Just tell them stories, it's like riding a bike it will come back to you, Noah, Cain & Able, Moses, Elijah, put some of those years of Catholic education to work. From that project, things like, "you're an accountant, help me with my chairmanship, or this annual diocesan appeal; or can you usher the 12:15 Mass for me, or can you be my proxy Tuesday night at the parish council meeting" were things I often heard.

Teaching turned out to be the key to success in planting the seed of vocation. It turned out not only was he good at it, but the students expected to see their teacher at Church, and after a substitute year he got his own class of fourth graders learning about reconciliation. Teaching the topic and modeling behavior to the students got John to the confessional and the war with God caused by his mother's death came to an end.

About this time, interviewing for positions in accounting revealed that a possibility of needing to relocate far from Davenport was likely. Arthur Anderson thought after a period of training at their school in Denver, seeing Brazil might be a probable destination. This caused a crisis of doubt about whether accounting should be pursued or if teaching? As a second semester College senior about to graduate what would be involved in obtaining an education degree since I already had the professional degree of accountant? In that era almost 90 hours of college credit or akin to going back to sophomore year! Today with the teacher shortage accommodation could make that considerably easier . . . to be continued next week.
