

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week, we pick up on the story about Jesus and his travels. Jesus is once again on his way to Jerusalem; something we have been hearing about for some weeks now. He has left the area of the Sea of Galilee and Mt Tabor and is on his way to Jerusalem to suffer and die at the hands of men. As we have seen by the apostles' responses, they have not wanted to fully comprehend or even hear this message. This is the eastern route that would have led them along the Jordan River through the city of Jericho. As we hear in the Gospel, Jesus' reputation has reached the people of Jericho and they have come out to see him.

Jericho is an interesting location. It is not far from where the Israelites, who, after having wandered for forty years, made their crossing of the Jordan River. After the Israelites had crossed the Jordan River, they were instructed to go to the city of Jericho. It was here where the people marched around the city, with the ark, and on the seventh day they blew their horns and the walls came down. And if we remember, Jesus was also baptized by John near this location at the Jordan river. Afterwards Jesus would go into the wilderness, and be tempted by Satan. This wilderness was in the foothills and cliffs just outside of Jericho. This is a rugged dry area and so would Jericho be if it did not have some springs which give it nourishment.

So you may be asking, what are we to gather from this information about a city which lies 850 feet below sea level. Well, like Bartimaeus, and the apostles, we have all prevented our eyes from seeing what God's plan is for us. We continue to grow in this understanding throughout our lives. But, perhaps we have also been the ones who have been like the crowds gathered around Jesus and are the ones trying to prevent Bartimaeus from seeing Jesus. Have we noticed how our world is crying out today, yet they, and we, like the apostles, have not developed the clear vision of who Jesus is, to help those who have only heard of Jesus by name. Unless it is by sure determination, they don't make it into Jesus' presence. It is a long way up to Jerusalem which sits 2,475 feet above sea level while Jericho is 850 feet below sea level. Like the apostles, are we ready for the climb?



Inspiration for the week

"To fall in love with God is the greatest romance; to seek Him the greatest adventure; to find Him the greatest human achievement." These words of St. Augustine are timeless. Every human being would certainly profit with wisdom if they realized Who calls them and to Whom they belong. There is only one way to satisfy the deepest longing of the human heart and that is in relationship with our Creator. When we seek God with true sincerity of heart and God passes us along our way, we will cry out, "Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me!" We will instinctively know that it is only our Divine Master who can restore our sight and heal us. The blind man fell in love with Jesus, embarked upon this life-saving adventure to reach him and achieved a goal many have only remotely thought possible. This is mercy in action. No matter how far we stray or how blind we become God patiently waits to console us, guide us, and heal us. All we need to do is desire Him with all our heart.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Peter of Alcantara was born in Alcantara, Spain in 1499. His father was the Governor of the province and his mother came from a noble family. He was privately tutored and attended the University of Salamanca. After he returned home from university, he was accepted as a Franciscan Friar of the Stricter Observance in 1515. He was ordained as a priest in 1524 and in 1525 he became Guardian of the friary of St. Mary of the Angels.

Throughout his life, St. Peter of Alcantara took up his spiritual cross and preached with great success to the poor, but also spend much of his time in solitude. From 1553 to early 1555, he spent this time alone in meditation and prayer. Soon following, St. Peter made a pilgrimage to Rome, barefoot the entire way. While in Rome he obtained permission from Pope Julius III. to establish friaries.

St. Peter was known for frequently experiencing ecstasy, a state where he was entirely consumed with the warmth and light of the Holy Spirit. These euphoric moments were common during his prayer and meditation.

When he was near death, St. Peter took to his knees and prayed. When he was offered water, he refused it, saying, "Even my Lord Jesus Christ thirsted on the Cross." He died while in prayer on October 18, 1562. On April 18, 1622, he was declared blessed by Pope Gregory XV and later canonized by Pope Clement IX on April 28, 1669


